Member Passing Phyllis "Dot" Welber Feldman July 30, 1926 – April 1, 2019



Phyllis "Dot" Welber Feldman, a pioneer in the field of modern mental health, passed away on Monday, April 1, 2019, at the age of 92. Born on July 30, 1926, in Columbus, Ohio, Dot was the eldest of three children. She married Herbert Feldman in 1946 with whom she

had two children, Carol and David. Dot devoted the next 20 years to her family and to Temple Beth-El in South Bend. Dot was preceded in death by her parents, Sig and Bess Welber, her son, David Feldman and her former husband of 28 years, Herbert Feldman.

Dot enjoyed spending time with her professional and life partner of 46 years, Kay Grask, at their summer home in South Haven, Michigan, or their winter haven in Green Valley, Arizona. She loved visiting with family and friends, swimming, cooking and reading. An avid fan of Notre Dame Women's Basketball, she was a season ticket holder for decades. Dot was a member of Beth Shalom Temple Center in Green Valley, Arizona and Temple Beth-El in South Bend, Indiana. She was a past president of the Temple Beth-El Sisterhood and was awarded 1966 Temple Sisterhood Woman of the Year. For her community activism, Dot was named 2007 Health, Human and Public Service Woman of the Year by the YWCA of St. Joseph County, Indiana, in their annual Tribute to Women.

Temple Costs

There has been a lot of discussion recently about the behind the scenes costs to conduct functions at BSTC. Per Mike Benisch, facilities chairman these are the costs. If there are any questions please contact the Temple office 520-648-6690.

Kitchen – When we have someone come in to set up, take down, wash/put away food items and necessary utensils etc. it costs us **\$45**. If additional people are required they are paid \$15 per hour with a three hour minimum.

Cleaners – The cleaners come to the Temple on a weekly basis. They vacuum, clean the bathrooms, wash the floors etc. We pay them \$45. They do not do dishes. If we need them a second time during the week it's an additional \$45.

Set up/Take down of the Sanctuary – The normal set up of the sanctuary is three rows of chairs facing the bima and 6 round tables each with 8 chairs. Any time this set up needs to be changed i.e. Bagel Brunch, Passover Seder or a concert it costs the Temple \$30.
