Dear BSTC Members:

We are pleased to have Steve Levine, our new Membership Coordinator, onboard. Steve has been working under the mentorship of Mike Finkelstein to help rebuild our membership.

Changes to the Dissolution portion of our Articles of Incorporation have been approved and accepted to state that, upon dissolution of BSTC, our assets will go to a *Jewish* synagogue or charity. The updated Articles of Incorporation can be found on our website.

All of you have been curious to know the details of the Fish Estate. We are currently only part way through the probate process; however, I am pleased to announce that we have received \$50,000 from the estate, of which \$5000 will be set aside for annual Bagel Breakfasts to honor Lou and Helene Fish (which will be free to all temple members,) and \$45,000 will be invested to give the temple an interest income. As a result of the generosity of Lou and Helene Fish, a leaf has been inscribed on the Tree of Life honoring their lives; and a plaque has been installed over the kitchen door dedicating the kitchen to their memory.

A temple friend will be honored at the November 6th Bagel Breakfast. Margaret Bierd, our office manager, has selflessly worked above and beyond her paid duties to temple. Margaret will receive a leaf on the Tree of Life, an honorary temple membership and a ceramic pot for her garden with an inscribed "necklace" on it in appreciation of BSTC.



INTRODUCING STEVE LEVINE: BSTC'S NEW MEMBERSHIP COORDINATOR

Steve was born and raised in a Jewish household in Cincinnati, Ohio, graduating from high school in 1969. He holds a BA with honors in Political Science from the University of Cincinnati and studied Government and Public Administration at the George Washington University in Washington, D.C.

Steve has been coming to Arizona for a while now but staying in Tucson. In 2015 he and his wife Karen who, sadly passed away shortly after moving to Green Valley, attended a Tubac arts festival. On their way back to Tucson, for no apparent reason, they exited I-19 at Continental Road, looked around, and liked what they saw. Later they stopped at a real estate company and purchased a home. It was, according to Steve, "a good decision," one that we at BSTC can agree with.

He has successfully worked for and with numerous public agencies, associations, and for-profits in order to advance the public interest. One example is the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), where Steve coordinated the provision of disaster assistance as a member of the Response and Recovery Division. It was at this agency where Steve first encountered the challenges facing small synagogues. While in a small Mississippi town, following a flood, "I noticed a building with a Star of David above the front door and inquired about it with an elderly lady living next door. Noticeably sad, she explained that, once a functioning synagogue, it was no longer in use. The young people had moved away for opportunities in big cities and there weren't enough people left to support the synagogue anymore"

Steve was a founder of the National Association of Environmental Risk Auditors and served as its Executive Vice President. He also owned a real estate appraisal and consulting practice in the Cincinnati area and specialized in litigation support and expert witness testimony.

Presently, besides being our membership coordinator, Steve is an Arizona licensed real estate agent with a local residential brokerage house.

His affiliations include the American Legion and the Elks. Some of his interests are playing golf ("not very well"), dogs in general, and golden retrievers in particular." In the past, he and his wife have had several dogs including a golden retriever named Martha Layne named for the Governor of Kentucky (Martha Layne Collins) where they were living at the time and later a golden named Bogey and a Shetland sheepdog named Bacall. Pet free at the moment, Steve is unsure about his status as a future pet owner.

Steve has begun to meet BSTC members at Bagel Breakfasts and Board meetings and looks forward to meeting more members as well as helping further BSTC's outreach.

Diversity can be found in abundance in our beautiful library. It is nothing short of amazing! Our readers have requested that we do book reviews. Here they are!

Fiction: War Brides (Helen Bryan) - top shelf of the library cart. In 1939 the lives of five young women, most evacuees, mesh in a sleepy English town where a bond is formed among them as the war draws near creating hardships and privations that become commonplace. Despite distance and time, the ties among these women lasts a lifetime. The courage and strength of these women and also of wartime England is to witness strength and fortitude as they help each other and their neighbors. One such hero is a teenage bride from Austria who was too old for the Kinder Transport but whose desperate efforts are displayed.

At the end of the war four of the women return to celebrate the 50-year anniversary of VE day. But are the women there only to commemorate or remember, or for something else? Read and find out.

As Close to Us As Breathing (Elizabeth Poliner) (top of library cart) - "Bagel Beach" in Connecticut has long been a summer destination of Jewish families. The story is told as seen from the eyes of a twelve-year-old girl who opens the book by telling us about a terrible accident that has occurred during this summer, the summer of 1948. The details are withheld until the very end, but throughout we are introduced to two of her aunts and her mother as well as the other relatives and friends. The book also details the lives of traditional Jews post World War II as they come against the modernity of American life.

We are Your Sons: The Legacy of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg - written by their sons Robert and Michael Meeropol- (Men's Bio Shelf). Robert and Michael Rosenberg lived Lines From The Library continued....

very ordinary lives until their parents, at the height of the McCarthy communist scare, were arrested and found guilty of passing A-bomb secrets to Russia. Eventually adopted by Anne and Abel Merepool, the brothers discuss their memories of this harrowing time as well as their own growth in the politically volatile era of the 1960's. Interwoven throughout the book are letters Ethel and Julius wrote while in prison.

BSTC makes it easy to study the Torah weekly. Meeting every Shabbat morning at 10:00 a.m., BSTC Torah Study studies and discusses the weekly Torah Portion for about two hours. You are welcome to attend whether or not Torah Study is a new experience. Weekly attendance is not required nor is knowledge of Hebrew. Books are provided.

Following Simchat Torah, the cycle begins again and during the months of November and December we return to **The Book of Genesis (B'reishit)**. Except for once a month, members of the group facilitate Torah Study. For all those in need of healing and health the *Mishaberach* (Prayer for Healing) is sung at the conclusion of Torah study followed by the reciting of the Mourner's Kaddish for our loved ones who have died during the last 11 months or for those observing a Yahrzeit.

WISH YOU WERE THERE

"ROAD" SCHOLARS

In mid September twelve folks from Green Valley, mostly BSTC members joined 23 others in a Road Scholar program in New Mexico devoted to the topic of *Conversos* and Crypto-Jews.

In 1492 the Alhambra Decree (the Expulsion Edict) forced Spain's Jewish citizens to make a decision: convert to Christianity or leave the country. Over the next 500 years, Conversos (those forced to convert) and Crypto-Jews —who practiced their faith in secrecy—migrated to the New World and finally to New Mexico, the outer reaches of New Spain. Our group heard from a number of interesting speakers, including several Conversos. We also had the privilege of visiting a special exhibit, "Fractured Faiths, Spanish Judaism, the Inquisition, and New World Identities" on loan from Spain. We actually saw one of the only two copies of the Expulsion Edict still remaining.

Thank you to Gary Friedman for organizing this worthwhile trip. We plan to develop a program here at BSTC, open to the public that will explore this fascinating topic.
