Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

"TZEDEK TZEDEK TIRDOF!"
ARE YOU A "RODEF TZEDEK"?

The phrase is well-known: "Justice, Justice you shall pursue!" It comes originally from the Torah's Book of Deuteronomy, but it has entered the list (some would say that it tops the list) of the most significant imperatives in all of Jewish literature. Yet, the reality is that the Hebrew term *Tzedek/Tzedakah* is frequently misunderstood or misused . . .

Briefly, our community's interpretation of the word *Tzedakah* is quite different from the simple sense of 'charity' (although I admit that charity itself is not a simple concept!) It is much more than a single act of generosity or humankindness. And, you might know that our tradition is filled with descriptions and categories of "charitable" financial or behavioral contributions. I hope to lead a learning session or two during the Winter months about this topic.

Similarly, you might have heard of certain Rabbis or Community Leaders being referred to *Tzadikim* (holy ones), recognized for their piety, devotion, or inspirational lives. Stories are told, myths have been developed, legends recalled, as synagogues or towns claim that theirs is the most beloved character of the country, or of the world, or of the generation!

But I would suggest that Tzedek/Tzedakah – which we are all called upon to pursue (for the Biblical command is in the singular, not plural form), is a Mitzvah which all of us are already practicing, at least occasionally. We don't perform these deeds of righteousness or justice for the sake of a tax deduction, nor for notoriety, recognition or fame; we believe in Tzedakah because we know that it's the right

thing to do, as Jews and as human beings (children of God, if you will). Also, please note that the phrase <u>repeats</u> the goal: "Justice, Justice you shall pursue!" Traditional commentary rephrases it as 'Justice must (only) be pursued justly'; others derive the lesson that often Justice is twice-as-hard to pursue or even envision.

My interpretation is that the doubling of the term means that Tzedek/Tzedakah is both visible and invisible, near and far, easy and difficult. Because it's a human concept, it is filled with incongruities and imperfections. Yet is something which we MUST pursue, seek and follow after. Some 36 years ago (double-Chai!!), I developed this thought as an action project for the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism in Washington, DC, then headed by my dear friend, Rabbi David Saperstein (who had installed and blessed me as Senior Rabbi of Temple Kol Ami in Michigan). I came up with the practice which we called "Rodef Tzedek" ('Pursuer of Justice'), and I would like to continue it here in Green Valley at BSTC: During each Shabbat or Festival Worship Service, a Temple or Community member is invited to speak for 2-3 minutes about a charity, cause or project in which he/she is involved as an act or acts of justice, charity, righteousness or kindness. This is NOT for personal glory, but rather, to introduce others to a cause which is important to you and, ideally, to inspire them to join you in this activity. We discourage requests for financial contributions, and encourage an explanation of the agency and/or how easy and meaningful it is to help out. There is a further, significant imperative in Jewish tradition: "Mitzvah goreret Mitzvah!" Each Mitzvah performed leads to another Mitzvah! If you would be willing to serve as a "Pursuer of Justice" over the next few months, please let me know directly!

Finally, please watch for more information about our 1st Shabbaton-Retreat weekend, to be held in January. In addition to socializing, relaxing, recreating, praying and (of course) eating together, I will be leading some discussions and experiences helping us better understand the "Coming to the Promised Land of America" immigration which welcomed the Jews in the early 20th century.


Upcoming Brotherhood Events:

The BSTC MEMBER SURVEY has seen a very good response! Thank you to all members who took the time to give us their feedback. Completed surveys were returned from 54 out of an estimated 127 households. They have been tabulated and the Board reviewed those results this month, deciding on any actions. A summary follows:

- 9 respondents have been members less than two years; 17 have been members 2-5 years; and 28 more than 5 years
- ◆ 45 respondents are full time residents; 7 are part time; 3 are outside the area
- 17 respondents are interested in a different dues structure; 28 are okay with what we have; 11 were unsure

- ◆ 50 respondents said communication was good (THANK YOU!) and two said there was too much
- 42 respondents are happy with the frequency of Shabbat services, one person wants more
- 18 people want in-person activities, 8 virtual, and 27 want a hybrid of the two
- The most popular activities indicated were:
 26 holidays, 13 food, 11 services
- 31 said yes, we should we partner with other congregations; 14 said maybe; 2 said no
- 9 feel Southern Arizona knows about BSTC; 24 said no; 10 said we need more outreach
- 8 indicated they want to become more involved (PLEASE CONTACT RUTHANN) and 34 said not right now
- Building expansion most popular ideas were: gift shop, followed by classroom/conference room/schmoozing area and worship space
- The Board has decided to reconvene the Long Range Planning Committee after the 2022 Board has been elected. This committee will be charged with looking at different dues structures that could possibly be used in the future to fund BSTC, and activities and how to keep up member interest up.

As to partnering with other congregations and getting our name out, BSTC is now a participant with the Jewish Federation of Southern Arizona Roundtable and we are working with as many publications in our area as we can identify to get our name out there.

We invite you, our members, to continue sending us your ideas. BSTC belongs to all of us!
