#### WISH YOU WERE THERE

On February 8, as part of the Know Your Roots Exhibit curated by Marcia Wiener, Professor David Graizbord of the University of Arizona gave a talk on the current state of the Jewish people with an emphasis on central and Eastern Europe.

Dr Graizbord talked about the history of how we Jews came to live in various countries, especially the United States. In doing so he debunked a popular myth that many of us believed in - the myth of "Shoin Fergessen." Officials at Ellis Island or Castle Gardens would have had no time to change names with the many immigrants pouring through.

In his talk, Dr. Graizbord cautioned us about the rising Anti-Semitism around the world, mentioning that anti-Israel sentiment is the more modern focus of anti-Jewish feeling.

Beginning in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, he spoke of the "deal" that certain countries wanted to give the Jews. The deal was that each Jew would be allowed to participate in the civil, intellectual and business life of the country. Prior to the 19<sup>th</sup> century, European Jews used their own courts, legal code, and so on. Many rulers were happy with this arrangement since it relieved them of the burden of governing the Jews.

#### Wish You Were There continued

However, in order to be considered full and loyal citizen and participate **in** "the deal," Jews would have to give up the "special" nationhood of the Jewish people, i.e. be countrymen first and Jews second.

We American Jews are a fine example of the emancipated Jew, able to participate in every part of American life, unlike the Chasidim who still rely on religious courts to adjudicate problems. For example, to divorce the Chasid must obtain a *Get*, something that is easy for a man to obtain. However, unless a woman receives a *get* from her husband she is not considered divorced even if she has gotten a civil divorce. Her status within the community is as an *agunah* – a chained wife, unable to date or remarry within the religious community. While a wife can sue for divorce in a *bet din*, a Jewish

court, and while the *bet din* can order the husband to issue the get, the husband can still refuse.

Dr. Graizbord's talk reminded me of growing up in Williamsburg (part of Brooklyn, NY), witnessing what our lives were like in Eastern and Central Europe in pre-holocaust days.
