Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

Dear Friends,

I'm very concerned. And this article for the Shofar could easily have been focused on any of the things that bother me (Indeed, I have rewritten this several times already!) I'm worried about the US mid-term elections, the results and what they will mean for the future of our democracy, and even more, about how both "sides" will react to those results. I'm worried about a somewhat similar situation in Israel, the immediate results of which our tour group will see and feel while we are there. I'm worried about trends towards totalitarianism and brinkmanship and authoritarianism around the world. I'm worried about imminent threats to civil rights and human rights and individual rights, as well as the reality that we are losing respect for each other, each other's feelings and beliefs – too many people think and act as if they are the only ones who are right.

But, having written all the above, I must add some comments about another concern – and I am certain that most of you are starting to share that concern, as well. Please permit me to "borrow" some context from my friend and colleague, Rabbi Paul Kipnes of California, who wrote recently, in light of the antisemitic tirades by Kanye/Ye and other hate-filled actions around the world:

"We live in a country where (such) speech – including racism, antisemitism, homophobia, hate against Asians and against people with disabilities [NTR adds 'immigrants and refugees'] – is increasingly prominent and increasingly tolerated in too many quarters. We Jews know that words matter, because

words illuminate the hidden hatreds that foreshadow and inspire acts of violence by others."

I join Rabbi Kipnes in condemning the antisemitism of both the extreme left and the extreme right, the BDS and anti-Zionism trends of the one, and the white supremacy and nationalist/fascist themes of the other. These movements, in one way or another, adhere to the same basic thought – that Jews are the root of the world's evils. Recognizing the rise of hate groups and their misleading re-telling of history is a threat to all of us, especially to Jews.

BSTC is planning to host a workshop/panel discussion early in 2023 on this issue. We will be inviting experts to share their analyses and suggest how we, in Green Valley, can be involved in combatting antisemitism. Please watch for more information about the program.

For now, here are some of the suggestions which I am finding that others, around North America, are telling their communities:

So as not to bring more attention, validity or online visibility to these hate groups, **do not "click on"** or Google-search any of their links or websites;

Report to the AntiDefamation League, the Jewish Philanthropies of Southern Arizona (formerly the Jewish Federation), or local police ANY antisemitic activity or behavior of which you are made aware;

Condemn—in letters to newspapers, messages to civic or political leaders—and ask others to speak out against, acts of hatred, racism and antisemitism in any form.

Reminder: BE ON TIME or you will need to ring the doorbell. Doors will be locked when services begin.



Their ultimate and successful plan is a tech-savyy solution to stop people from polluting,

This story - and how it was created virtually while Leslie and Dennis Fellner and their 8-year-old granddaughter Maya Slobe lived in two separate countries during the

COVID-19 pandemic - is a true work of love and connection that comes at a time when so many people are separated and feeling isolated. It is our hope that it brings readers a bit of joy and light during these difficult times, and helps them think about creative ways they can reach out to those in their lives who matter most.

About the authors: Maya Slobe (co-creator and illustrator) is an artist and third-grader at El Jardín elementary school in Chacala, Nayarit, Mexico. She loves drawing, painting, engraving, printmaking, exploring nature, and spending time with her family and friends, including the real-life members of the Green Gang:
Luna, Ela and Alex. She and her grandparents, Leslie and Dennis Fellner, met online once-a-week over six
