community leaders during the Ten Days of Repentance between Rosh HaShana and Yom Kippur. Many of those who are buried here do not have family members residing locally, and so it is incumbent upon us to attend the Service for them and recite Kaddish as well as other memorial prayers.

And, please notify me or Stacy in the BSTC Office of any children, grandchildren, nieces or nephews, etc. who have been born or adopted into your extended families since last Yom Kippur. Just as we read the names of those who have died during the past year at our Yizkor Service on Yom Kippur, we joyfully go from sadness to joy as we immediately welcome those babies or children who have joined our People in the last 12 months with a hearty "Mazel Tov!"

I want to draw your attention to two communitywide events that link together with the themes we will be sharing during the High Holy Days, sadly: On Tuesday evening, September 24<sup>th</sup>, Rabbi Jonah Pesner, a friend who is one of the leading Religious Activists and Jewish Spokesmen of this generation, will be speaking at the Tucson Jewish Museum and Holocaust Center. His presentation will be both in person and live-streamed, but advanced registration is required (though there is no charge). His topic is formidable: "Antisemitism and Democracy". We can all benefit from his guidance in preparing for the Days of Awe and the 2024 U.S. Election.

And more information will be forthcoming about the Tucson Jewish Community's October 7<sup>th</sup> Commemoration, to be held at the JCC on that Monday evening. We are working on providing transportation for those from Green Valley who wish to attend in person, and registration will be required. Furthermore, the <u>end</u> of this year's I.J.S. will actually usher in the <u>beginning</u> of a new chapter in the life of Beth Shalom Temple Center. On Simchat Torah eve, Wednesday, October 23<sup>rd</sup>, we will welcome and dedicate our new Torah Scroll! You will be receiving a separate invitation to this celebration, as we sing and dance and each-one-of us has the chance to join in the procession, reciting a special blessing and thanking all those who contributed and supported the realization of this dream over the last 2 years!

Finally, an amazing group of volunteers have been devotedly planning for our special 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gala, to be held on Saturday evening, November 9<sup>th</sup>, at the Desert Diamond Conference Center. Details and plans for the event are available through the Temple website [bstc.us] or the special Beth Shalom Temple Center Gala page and group on Facebook. We will be celebrating our past and helping provide for our future, honoring Joyce Finkelstein and Pat Shearer, enjoying great food, music, dancing and a performance by Tucson's famous 'Unscrewed Theater' improvisation group.
