

Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

December 2020 Chanukah 5781

For many, a highlight of the last few weeks of each secular year has been the announcement of a Man/ Woman of the Year award, along with the "Best Of ..." lists. With so much extra time on our hands this season, because of the tragic Covid-19 situation, it might be illuminating (for the Festival of Lights!) to suggest the following:

The year is 165 BCE, the year of the Chanukah story. Who shall the judges consider for our "Person of the Year" recognition?

Undoubtedly, many will nominate Mattityahu, the spiritual father of the Maccabbees. It was he who inspired and ignited their rebellion against the Syrian-Greeks, at a time when most of the people felt hopeless and depressed, if not even disconnected from their Judaism.

Others will propose the name of Judah, the son and military hero. Didn't he carry the day on the battlefield? Didn't he motivate his followers to rededicate (the meaning of the term Chanukah) the desecrated Temple?

Some will argue, "Why not a woman of the year?" Namely Hannah, who gave her seven sons in martyrdom in a supreme act of faith. Without those like her, ordinary men and women, the Jews' war for religious liberty would not have been won.

But I recall a teaching from an Orthodox Rabbi in the 1980's who advised that his candidate for "Man of the Year" should be the unknown Kohein (Priest) in (Continued on page 4)

Jerusalem who, despite all the gloom and despair, despite the darkness of oppression and destruction that he witnessed - the Temple being defiled, soldiers killing his people all around – this man hid a little can of consecrated oil for future use, for a time of redemption and salvation in which he firmly believed.

We don't know his name; we don't even know if the legend and story about the oil lasting for 8 days is true. But does it really matter? What DOES matter is the realization that the darkness WILL give way to light, and that, in our bleakest days, small acts of goodness, faith and hope can make each of us worthy of being remembered and honored. Each of us can be a small candle that helps bring warmth and life to others.

Chag Sameach – have a happy and meaningful Chanukah Festival! And stay healthy!

The Men's Club believe we are providing you several safe options which you will enjoy while celebrating this Hanukkah. Each evening of Hanukkah we will provide you with a recommended virtual Hanukkah event(s) that we think you will enjoy.

1 Candle Lighting – Thursday Evening, December 10

Go to **virtualmenorah.com** to learn how to light and enjoy a very safe virtual Hanukkah menorah. If you struggle with candle lighting or forgot to pick-up your candles, you may choose to continue observing your Hanukkah virtually each evening at this site. No messy candles to clean-up.

Our recommended evening activity is to view the performance of the Jewish cappella group **Six13** performing **A Hamilton Chanukah**.

2nd Candle Lighting – Friday Evening, December 11th

Our recommended evening activity is to view the 2nd candle lighting with former president Barach Obama as he celebrated Hanukkah at the White House with Rabbi Angela Warnick Buchdahl. Rabbi Buchdahl is the senior rabbi at New York City's Central Synagogue and also the first Asian American woman to be ordained as both a cantor and a rabbi.

3rd Candle Lighting – Saturday Evening, December 12th

Our recommended evening activity is to view Debbie Friedman performing several Hanukkah songs including *The Latke Song, Not by Might, and The Dreidel Song.*

4th Candle Lighting – Sunday Evening, December 13th

Enjoy an afternoon Hanukkah Celebration with Rabbi Roman providing some holiday inspiration and music. The Men's Club will be providing some Hanukkah decorations and treats. Wear your protective face mask and bring your own chair, so we can socially distance and celebrate safely outside in our beautiful BSTC garden area. **The festivities begin at 1:00 pm.**

7th Candle Lighting – Wednesday Evening, December 16th

Our recommended evening activity, to ensure we add some humor, is to view comedian **Adam Sandler's** *The Hanukkah Song.*

8th Candle Lighting – Thursday Evening, December 17th

After you light our last Hanukkah candle, and are now just a few weeks from beginning 2021 our recommended evening activity is to view a couple renditions of our traditional Jewish prayer for peace:

- ◆ Two of the best cantors in America, Cantor Azi Schwartz and Rabbi-Cantor Angela Warnick Buchdahl, sing together *Oseh Shalom*
- Senior Cantor Azi Schwartz and Cantor Rachel Brook, both with New York City's Park Avenue Synagogue, sing Oseh Shalom to the tune of "Shallow"

Rabbi Roman and the Men's Club hope you enjoy the activities we have shared with you and that your 2020 Hanukkah is joyful and safe. Oseh Shalom, may 2021 be a more peaceful year for all of us.
