President's Message

First, Happy Fourth of July. For me this holiday has been, along with Thanksgiving, the quintessential holiday as an American. In politics my guiding principle has been what's good for America, but somehow with the events of October 7, I need to consider what is good for us in politics in America and as a Jew.

It is a known fact that antisemitism has been on the rise exponentially. My parents moved from a small town in Maine to New York so that we can be raised with Jewish values and experiences. Rightly or wrongly, we were taught that what we did reflected on us as jews. I still remember so called friends when they were angry at me saying "don't play with Esther, she killed Christ," or a neighbor in a thick, Italian accent telling my mother "Go back where she came from" and I don't think she meant Bath Maine.

While teaching at Long Island University (LIU), I was targeted by a professor there for protesting his lack of willingness to provide make-up exams for students who missed because of the High Holidays. He had a letter campaign against me, with references to giving precedence to" Moishe" and not Juan because of their ethnicity.

Recently, reading "Phillip Roth's The Plot Against America, I was struck by passage about the protagonist who escaped the Holocaust to come to America, wondering why he should support a Jewish homeland in Israel, America was his homeland.

October 7 changed a lot of our perceptions. Without Israel and support for Israel, the words of Elie Weisel saying "Never Again" is not so evident anymore. Without Israel, whether we disagree with its politics at times or not, there is a sense of real threat of annihilation once again. Israel is a country surrounded by many more thousands of people threatening its existence.

President's Message continued

Without Israel, I believe we would be in a much more precarious position.

Along with Kent J. Blumenthal and his wife, Becky Charboneau, we represented BSTC at a program at the Tucson Jewish Community Center" United Against Hate: A Department of Justice Community Initiative- An Evening with the Jewish Community. Along with 200 participants we heard panel discussions and presentations from a wide variety of individuals, including the FBI, Pima County Sherrif's Department, The Tucson Police Department and the U.S. Attorney's Office.

Besides getting statistics on the rising reports of antisemitism – that even presenters admit, is not the whole picture, we learned about the distinction between a hate crime and a hate incident. Except for my experience at LIU, the examples I gave above were hate incidents. The full extent of the campaign against me at LIU, which I have not gone into in this column, would have been considered a hate crime.

One thing that was really brought home to us, whether antisemitism manifests itself as a hate crime or hate incident, it needs to be reported. Call 911 if its immediate threatening, or otherwise to the FBI, local police, sheriff's department or even the Jewish Federation. Many times, hate incidents may show a pattern of behavior that can be used in prosecution of hate crimes.

We at BSTC are very lucky to have Kent J. Blumenthal and his Stand with Israel Committee who tirelessly work to get the word out about antisemitisms and the falsities reported about the ongoing conflict in Israel and the terrorists who aim to empty Israel of Jews by driving us "from the river to the sea" not only in Israel, but around the world.

Kudos need to go out to Kent also for applying and receiving a micro-grant from the Jewish Federation of Southern Arizona. The name of the project is "Stand with Israel! Advocacy Handbook" and will provide a way other synagogues and local Jewish organizations to establish similar committees" to defends itself against antisemitism that enables Hamas, Hezbollah, Houthis, Iran, and other radical terrorist regimes intent on Israel's destruction". The grant also supports the establishment of a website whereby our letters and others, can be filed thus providing a repository for us and other organization to access and use.

Included in the manual will also be a brief chronology of Eretz Yisrael's history from biblical times to the present conflict to inform the uninformed that Jews have lived in the land for millennia and that Israel is indigenous to the area and is not an apartheid state, or any of the other epithets thrown at it.

Benefits from this project include increasing the number of voices that stand against antisemitism and support Israel by countering anti-Israel and antisemitic editorials, opinions and articles published by news media outlets, as well as to informing and educating non-Jews of historical truths regarding Israel and antisemitism. It also will provide a web-based forum for pro-Israel advocates and writers to post and share 'Letters to Editors,' 'Opinions,' and 'In My View' communiques that have been submitted for publication to local and national news media outlets. The expected date for completion of this wonderful project is October 1, 2024.

- I am grateful to BSTC's 'Stand With Israel Committee' for providing all of us with information, clarity, and the voices by which our feelings, souls and consciences can be strengthened. Please continue to show your support for our People through financial contributions when possible, through maintaining personal contact (phone calls, emails, etc.) with those whom you know – whether in Israel or in our own community, as they are suffering and feeling alone as well – and keeping up-to-date with analyses and true accounts of the situation.
- [I recently learned of a unique program by which Retirees especially, can provide much-needed help to young Israelis. "English B'Yachad" (B'Yachad means 'together') offers a Volunteer in Israel FROM

HOME experience: arranging individualized English tutoring to help Israeli young adults improve their confidence and fluency in English, in order to better succeed in high-tech jobs.

- "As an EBY tutor, you experience Israel in a very special way – by getting to know Israel through your students as they navigate the Israeli labor market, experience fluctuations in the security situation, celebrate Jewish and Israeli national holidays and share family and life events."

Enough! Embracing Shabbat in a Consumerist World

John and I did not grow up celebrating Shabbat, but we've recently created a Shabbat observance that works for us. Inspired by Rabbi Norm's services, members of the congregation and also the Scandinavian ethic of 'Enough,' we've been incorporating these principle into our lives, and especially on Shabbat.

In 2019, global advertising spending surpassed \$590 billion, exposing individuals to nearly 10,000 marketing messages daily. The core mission of marketing is to instill a sense of inadequacy in consumers, urging them to purchase products to achieve fleeting happiness. Contrasting this, the Talmud's Ben Zoma states, "Who is wealthy? He who is happy with his lot." Similarly, Seneca observed, "It's not the man who has too little but the man who craves more who is poor."

A poignant illustration of this is when Kurt Vonnegut remarked that a wealthy host made more money in a day than Joseph Heller ever would from *Catch-22*. Heller responded, "Yes, but I have something he will never have: Enough."

Shabbat embodies this principle of enough, offering a time to pause and appreciate life's intrinsic perfection. It reminds us that joy comes from cherishing what we have, not from endless accumulation. In a world driven by the pursuit of more, Shabbat invites us to find wealth in contentment and peace in knowing we already have enough.
