After the IDF, I helped build a Moshav on the Golan Heights called Eliad named after the famed Israeli spy Eli Cohen who was captured by the Syrians and executed in 1963. I was a Cowboy for a few years until I returned to the US in 1980. In the US I went to school and eventually worked for Boeing for 34 years until retirement. I was responsible for the Illustrated Parts Catalog (IPC). The airlines use the IPC to maintain their spare parts inventory. Without the IPC, they refuse to take the airplane delivery.
