MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

President's Message December 2025

First, I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving, mindful of all the things we are thankful for. I also want to wish everyone a *Chag Sameach, or Happy Chanukah in which we celebrate this month. Chanukah, as most know, celebrates the rededication of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem, after it was desecrated by Syrian Greeks (Seleucids) trying to force the people to accept Greek beliefs and culture. As the story goes, the Maccabees defeated the Seleucids' army, driving the Greeks from the land.*

The miracle of Chanukah is that, in rededicating the Temple, the oil they had that was only enough for one night lasted 8 nights until new oil could be made.

I am an autograph collector, and I have many that I treasure, e.g., I.M. Pei, Justice Ginsburg, Isaac Bashevis Singer, Milton Berle, and even Harry Belafonte. Many in my collection come from just meeting people, whether at a museum or even a cigar store. Many others come from meeting these luminaries attending Long Island University (Brooklyn Campus) Graduation Ceremonies, as Chairperson of the Nursing Department. One of my most treasured autographs, however, is from Eli Weisel, who famously wrote "never again" after the atrocities experienced in Germany and World War II.

Antisemitism has always been with us, but somehow it seems to rear its ugly head too often for us to overlook it. Now is one of those times in which we see synagogues bombed, smeared with antisemitic graffiti, and people attacked. While known incidents

in Green Valley and Tucson are relatively low, many of us are still afraid to wear symbols that reflect our Jewish heritage. My son and daughter-in-law in New York have taken off their *Jewish Stars in public; however, when I visit, I wear signs of my Jewishness with pride.*

Newscasters interview known admirers of Hitler, and there is little outcry about it. On Sunday, November 23, the New York Times reports that tensions over antisemitism in the party, free speech, and Israel have burst to the forefront of G.O.P. politics and show signs of becoming a point of contention in 2026 primary races and beyond. The furor has reached the highest levels of government, with President Trump this past week defending Tucker Carlson, a friendly interview with the white nationalist Nick Fuentes, who has professed admiration for Hitler and Stalin.

I am not trying to be political here; certainly, we have much to thank President Trump for his past stance on Israel, nor do I think that Republicans are the only party to express antisemitic views. My aim here is to raise awareness of the growing rate of antisemitism in the United States and around the world.

In keeping with this, I am proud to write of the proposal Kent Blumenthal and Rabbi Roman are promoting: writing a microgrant to the Jewish Federation of Southern Arizona and the Weintraub Jewish Center for an outreach program by BSTC as a follow up to the gathering of congregants of BSTC and local churches in support of Israel and against hate that

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE (continued)

was held at the Presbyterian Church in Green Valley in December 2023 in response to the October 7 terrorist massacres in Israel.

The proposal is for a half-day (3-hour or so) workshop/colloquium especially for non-Jews in the Green Valley area, educating about Israel and the complexities and context for understanding October 7 and the "War of Redemption", reactions to the "peace plan", and how to battle antisemitism. A light lunch would be served, and local "experts" from UofA, the Holocaust Museum, and other organizations would serve as presenters. Working with the local Christian clergy, invitations would be arranged selectively, and pre-registration would be mandatory.

Hopefully, by the time you read this, the proposal will go before the board and be approved.

And once that is done, Kent, I, and the Rabbi will be seeking volunteers to work on this proposal and the presentation.

Again, Happy Chanukah

I shall pass this way, but once. Therefore, let me do what little I can now since I will not pass this way again.

BOARD NOTES

The monthly Board meeting is normally held on the fourth Monday of each month. **The next Board meeting is the Annual Meeting and Board Elections. It is scheduled for Monday, January 26th at 2pm.** All members are encouraged to attend and vote for the new Board. Members must be in good standing for their votes to be counted so dues must be paid before the meeting begins.

RESTRICTED (DESIGNATED) ACCOUNTS

While no specification is required, when making a general donation or tribute to BSTC, you may opt to specify that to the general fund, or to some other fund that represents your desires regarding where the money is used.

Following here is a list of the Restricted Accounts we have on our books. Some have been there for a while, and some are new. The money can only be used for the stated purpose if an account is restricted (designated).

- ◆ **Rabbi Discretionary Fund:** This will be a standard Discretionary fund to allow the Rabbi to donate as he sees appropriate.

- ◆ **Gratitude Fund:** This fund was set up allows us to subsidize some or all the cost of participation in rituals for our less fortunate members.

- ◆ **Garden Fund:** BSTC does have a budget for *property maintenance*. However, we may want to do something extra (special) for the garden, and this fund is for this.

- ◆ **Bikur Cholim (Caring Meals) Fund:** This fund is partially subsidized by a JPSA grant and provides meals and visitation to members who are recovering from illness/surgery.

- ◆ **Art Gallery Fund:** While the Art Gallery Committee has a budget for expected costs (hanging devices, receptions, honorariums for speakers), the committee chairs can use this fund to enhance the gallery at their discretion.

- ◆ **Membership Fund:** This account is set up to support the recruitment of new members to our Temple, through various means of communication outside the temple.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Easy Potato Latkes



Ingredients:

- 5 medium potatoes, peeled & grated
- 1 onion, grated
- 2 eggs, beaten
- ¼ cup matzo meal
- Salt & pepper to taste
- Oil for frying

Directions:

1. Squeeze excess liquid from potatoes/onion.
2. Mix with eggs, matzo meal, salt & pepper.
3. Heat oil in skillet; drop spoonfuls, flatten, and fry 3–4 min per side until golden.
