Rabbi Roman's Visit and Discussion Summary

On Tuesday evening, February 12, 2019, Rabbi Norman Roman presented "One Rabbi's Thoughts About the Twenty-first Century Synagogue and the Jewish Community" to a crowd of over 70 people at Beth Shalom Temple Center. Rabbi Roman has been hired to be BSTC's part-time Rabbi starting January 1, 2020. First he described his own background, and path to the rabbinate. This was followed by an interesting and perceptive overview of how Jewish institutions have changed in the last half of the 20th century, and the first decades of the 21st. Rabbi Roman concluded "the future is bright, the creativity is there, but we don't know the shape and content of Judaism to come". He advised us that although some young people may not like our way of practicing Judaism, this doesn't mean they reject everything. The talk was followed by questions, socializing and snacks. People enjoyed the evening and are now looking forward even more to Rabbi Roman and wife Lynne's arrival in Green Valley.

Suggestion Box—with Responses (NEW)

Have you noticed the Suggestion Box in the temple foyer? Approximately a year ago, some members brought to the Boards' attention that there was no anonymous way for members to voice comments, suggestions or complaints. This was a valid point so the Board authorized a box in the lobby, as well as outside the main door. Both boxes are available for

members' submissions. You need not sign your name to your suggestion. Going forward, to show members that their comments are being read and taken seriously, the President will address these in the Shofar as timely a manner as possible. Please remember that depending on the concern there may not be an immediate response.

Suggestions submitted since the last Board study session have been answered by the President (**question/suggestion**; *answer*) and include the following:

1. **BSTC Office times on newspaper ad were confusing.** *This has been addressed and new ads will feature the actual times that the office is open.*
2. **No water cups at the drinking fountain.** *We do not have a staff that can monitor the number of cups at the water fountain. Even if we had a dispenser it would still need to be monitored. If you find there are no cups at the water fountain, and there is no one using the kitchen, feel free to get some yourself. Simply go into the kitchen, turn left, and there are cups in the right side bottom cabinet closest to the refrigerator. If there is someone in the kitchen, ask them to please get some cups.*
3. **It would be nice if all the engraved bricks in the memorial garden were in one area and were all installed in one direction.** *The bricks were installed so that they could be read by anyone walking into the memorial garden from the parking lot. As there are two entrances from the parking lot, there are two paths, each with approximately half of the engraved bricks. There is one brick by the fountain, and if that were turned around you would need to stand in the fountain to read it.*

SOCIAL ACTION

Food Donations to the Green Valley Food Bank between September 2018 and January 2019 BSTC has donated 139 pounds of non-perishable food items to the Green Valley Food Bank.

Tree of Life (or L'Simcha) Congregation Donations were collected during November and December bagel breakfasts, and \$205 was given to the Tree of Life's account to support the families directly impacted by this Hate Crime shooting.

ADL No Place for Hate We continue to coordinate with the Phoenix ADL office to help them in expanding their "No Place for Hate" program to include schools in our local area. The Sahuarita Unified School District Superintendent, Dr. Manuel Valenzuela, has agreed to meet with the ADL Director to review their program. We are also working on the Continental School District Superintendent, Roxanna Rico, to set-up a meeting with the ADL Director.

Nogales Immigrant Support during the SAC January 24th meeting we were briefed by Justine Schnitzler on programs supporting Nogales area immigrants.

School Supplies for Title I Students at Green Valley Continental School District donations are being collected to purchase school supplies for Title I (low income families) students in our local school district during February and March.

"Day of Thanksgiving" inter-denominational activity is a major project, and was the central focus of the SAC January meeting. Our goal is to develop specific plans, timelines, and assign volunteers to support this project.

Youth on Their Own Program is a Tucson based program which also supports teenagers in south Pima and Santa Cruz counties, and provides support to homeless teenagers. We are relooking into this program which some of our congregation members have previously supported.

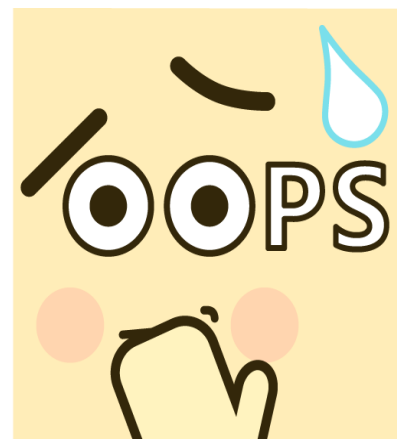
