Dear Friends,
The High Holy Days of Rosh HaShana and Yom Kippur are now less than 2 months away. Notes from the Sisterhood July 14 meeting

It was most gratifying to explore options for our new events calendar and realize that there are strategies we can employ to minimize the risk of Covid-19 while enjoying one another's company. We had a consensus regarding how to proceed with getting together observing social distancing and following appropriate sanitization protocols. The most popular suggestions included: visiting Canoa Hills Park, walking the Anza Trail, having a picnic lunch (individually prepared) at Desert Meadows Park, watching a movie and discussing it, tuning in to a TED talk and evaluating its teachings, a special program led by our own Fern Wargotz-Blizzard, possibly learning more computer skills with Ricki LeTowt, and a Zoom bake-in with Ruthann-based technological instruction to engineer this undertaking !!!!

When restrictions are ultimately lifted, and it is safer to be in larger groups, we have many venues from which to choose:

- ♦ A lecture by Susan Claussen, Director of the Invisible Theater in Tucson
- ♦ Mission Gardens (which sits on top of the oldest canal system in the United States and was maintained by three separate cultures !!!)

Since traditional fundraising must be postponed we will still respond to some of the

needs of the greater community of Green Valley and environs by making a \$200 donation to the Hands of a Friend (which offers refuge to victims of domestic violence; you will have read in the news that domestic violence is on the rise throughout the country) and a \$200 donation to Title I students at Sopori Elementary School (the poorest school in Arizona) in Amado for the purchase of important school supplies. As you know, our sisterhood dues are \$20 each year. In light of the fact that we are unable to generate greater income right now we hope, when the moment arrives to renew your membership, you will consider adding an extra amount to your dues (prompted by your heart).

It was heartwarming to read in the first "release" what inspires you, gives your day purpose, how you remain in touch with your loved ones, and how positive you are !!!
