Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

'COME AND LEARN'

Many of you are, I trust, familiar with the story in the Talmud of how a stranger approached (Rabbi) Hillel, asking him to teach all of the Torah while standing on one foot. While we don't know who was supposed to be standing and who was sitting, we do know Hillel's response: "Love your neighbor as yourself; what is hateful to you, do not do to anyone else. That is the whole Torah, all the rest is commentary. Now – come and learn!"

In conjunction with our exciting, year-long project of writing our new Torah Scroll, let me encourage you to join us during the months of January and February: "Come and Learn"! We have arranged speakers and opportunities to engage, educate, and enlighten you with background and insights about how Jews in various Jewish communities and throughout history have understood the Bible. How and why are certain stories included in the text? What do some of the complex Hebrew or Aramaic words really mean? Are the narratives "true"?

These discussions will also, I believe, not only add to your knowledge about the sacred literature of our people (we are known as "the People of the Book" don't forget!) but may introduce you to patterns of study or thought that could strengthen your faith and confidence as a Jew in the 21st century. Thanks to the generosity of some of our donors, and the scholarship of our visiting teachers, Beth Shalom Temple Center will, over the next 6 weeks or so, become a "Yeshivah", an academy of higher Torah education.
