Notes From the Board

Recently, at our open Board meetings, the Board has voted:

- 1. A dues increase—This has nothing to with the hiring of the Rabbi, those funds have been set aside. It has everything to do with the rising cost of paper, postage, ink, plates, napkins, cups, etc. BSTC has been operating in the red for at least the past two years. Dues for the 2020 calendar year will be \$300 per person.
- 2019 High Holidays—Once again we will be offering our High Holiday services to the community free of charge. This is our best chance to show those not affiliated with BSTC what they are missing, and hopefully they will join.
- A Thank You for the Mussman's for their years of service to BSTC—The Board voted for a very personal thank you that I am sure the Mussman's will appreciate.
- 4. **Break The Fast**—The cost of this year's Break The

Fast will be \$10 per person. As we did for the Passover Seder, your check will be your reservation. Checks can be sent to the temple: P.O. Box 884, Green Valley AZ 85622-0884.

- Wine—We will use traditional wine for rituals, but will try to have other wines available for those not liking the traditional wines.
- Credit Card Payments—We are looking into once again being able to take payments in nontraditional ways (credit/debit card, Apple Pay, etc.) and there will be more information to come about this.

Havurah

The word "Havurah" is derived from "Haver", the word for friend in Hebrew. It also has the meaning of



circle or friendship. So, a Havurah is usually expressed as a circle of friends. A circle of friends can create a very small community of nearby neighbors. For those who no longer have nearby family, a spouse, or loved one, it can provide a sense of belonging and the opportunity to have someone to reach out to: to share, to laugh, to grieve, to help us get through life's little problems.

A havurah does not replace our worship or temple activities—it just enables us to share our Jewishness on a more personal basis, day-to-day or week-to-week, or any other informal way in a kind and loving way. A havurah can be set up to share pot-luck Shabbat dinners, social events, hospital visits, or anything its members need or miss.

If you would be interested in starting or belonging to a Havurah, let us know. We will try to match you up with nearby people in your neighborhood.


