#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I'm sure we have all been riveted to our televisions to see the return of the latest round of hostages. What a wonderful feeling to see the chair on the bimah with Sagui Dekel-Chen's name removed and know that he is home with his family. But how sad and heartbreaking it was to see the next round of returned hostages, but with this time some of them in coffins. It is like the celebrations of *Yom HaZikaron* and *Yom HaAtzmaut* events.

These two events recall the tragedies and triumphs of the state of Israel, its settlers, soldiers, and people; Yom HaZikaron (Day of Remembrance) and Yom HaAtzmaut (Independence Day). How gratifying it was to see all of Israel stop what they were doing when the buzzer for Yom HaZikaron blared out, followed by the next day's celebration of Israel's independence.

Unfortunately, with this exchange of prisoners, the joy is mixed with sadness.

It is easy to become discouraged at the slow pace of negotiations and returns, as well as the still egregious refusal to identify Hamas as a terrorist organization on many newscasts. How many more children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren will face a lack of knowledge and disregard for facts and history? Will "Never Again" truly become a reality in my lifetime – I am beginning to doubt it.

Sorry for being so negative, but as we celebrate another Purim where we Jews had to protect ourselves against another leader wanting to annihilate us, followed by Pesach celebrating our entry into the "promised land" after being slaves in Egypt. Of

#### MESSAGE FROM RABBI NORM

#### 50 Years!

At Cincinnati's historic Plum Street Temple (built during the Civil War), in the city that Isaac M. Wise described as the "Jerusalem of the New World", my classmates and I were ordained as Rabbis in the Spring of 1975. Joyfully and prayerfully, we were honored at the recent Convention of the National Association of Retired Reform Rabbis (where I was elected First Vice-President), and will be blessed later in March by the Central Conference of American Rabbis. The Michigan Congregation that I served for more than 30 years (Temple Kol Ami) is hosting Lynne and me for a special Shabbat in recognition on March 21-22, and you are all invited to a celebration here at BSTC on Saturday evening, May 10.

The 50-year class members were asked to write brief statements about our Rabbinates to share with our younger colleagues and be collected at the American Jewish Archives. These are the words I submitted:

"Spring of 2025 - 50 years since ordination in Cincinnati (and further memories of five previous years at the Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion, with my student pulpits, and two and a half years of serving/training as 'pre-rabbinic intern' at my home congregation in Cleveland). It has been an entire lifetime of identifying and finding fulfillment as a Rabbi.

When asked why this was my chosen lifestyle, I inevitably respond that I never seriously considered doing anything else: teaching, working with youth, supporting those in need, being on the stage, helping the Jewish people, repairing the world, and wrestling

Unfortunately, as of this writing, we are once again in limbo. Will further exchanges be discontinued? I hope that by the time the next Shofar is published, we will again be able to celebrate.

I shall pass this way, but once. Therefore, let me do what little I can now since I will not pass this way again.

Chair Laurie Sherman has shared the following short article of interest, and a Passover-safe recipe.

#### **Stones Instead of Flowers**

In Jewish tradition, placing stones on graves symbolizes permanence, memory, and connection. Unlike flowers, which wither, stones endure, representing the lasting impact of a person's life. The custom may stem from ancient shepherding practices, where pebbles helped track flocks, reflecting the idea of God keeping souls in His care. Some believe stones prevent spirits from wandering, echoing Eastern European Jewish folklore. Biblical and Talmudic traditions emphasize stones in altars and sacred sites, reinforcing their spiritual significance. Ultimately, placing stones affirms that while life is fleeting, memory and the bonds of faith remain steadfast and unbroken.



#### Flour-Free Passover Chocolate Almond Cake



This rich, flourless cake is perfect for Passover and incredibly easy to make!

#### Ingredients:

- 6 oz bittersweet chocolate, chopped
- ½ cup unsalted butter or margarine
- ¼ cup sugar
- 3 large eggs
- 1 cup almond flour
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- ¼ tsp salt

#### Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease an 8-inch round cake pan and line with parchment paper.
- 2. Melt chocolate and butter together in a heatproof bowl over simmering water or in the microwave in short bursts. Stir until smooth.
- 3. Whisk in sugar, eggs (one at a time), vanilla, and salt. Fold in almond flour until fully combined.
- 4. Pour batter into the pan and smooth the top.
- 5. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until set but slightly soft in the center. Let cool before serving.

Dust with powdered sugar or cocoa, or serve with fresh berries. Enjoy this simple, delicious Passover treat!

Tip: For a nut-free version, substitute potato starch for almond flour.
