#### Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

IT'S PURIM TIME!

I can hear you asking: "Celebrating Purim under COVID limitations and conditions? Gaiety while facing an historic rise in Anti-Semitism around the world? Seriously?" And my response, as I understand Jewish tradition and teaching is: "Absolutely!"

No Jewish festival quite measures up to Purim. It has been described as the most serious yet boisterous 24 hour observance, "a day of Megilah and masquerade, groggers and grog" (Rabbi Israel Jacobs). It marks a day in our history when genocide was averted, when "grief was transformed into joy", and just as the Jews of Persia were granted light and gladness, thus, we pray, can it be for us. For were it not for the remarkable turn of events in Shushan of old, we might not be around to celebrate anything today!

Note well – one lesson is that in order to experience joy, we must acknowledge the memory of grief. Mordecai had lived through the destruction of Jerusalem, and then again, now in exile, he and his people came within a hair's-breadth of extinction. But when Esther saved the day, bringing good fortune and safety, when Mordecai himself was dressed by order of the King in "robes of blue and white, with a magnificent gold crown, and a mantle of fine linen and purple wool", the Jews of Shushan rejoiced. They had almost been destroyed, but the tide turned, and they appreciated their good fortune all the more.

The stories abound of Purim being celebrated in the Shtetls of Eastern Europe, in the streets of North Africa, along the canals of Venice, and in the 4 holy

cities of what will, as of 1948, be known as the State of Israel. (But, you might know, that the isolated Jews of Ethiopia did not celebrate, for the word never reached them that Esther and Mordecai prevailed against Haman, and that the Persian Jews had been saved.) Purim was, and is, a time for excitement, relief, and utter, complete joy of heart and soul.

But a further lesson is a clear realization that merriment and rejoicing must be seen in proper context. Amalek in the Torah and Haman in the Megilah may be dead, but the evil they represented is not. We cannot let our minds be turned away from the sorrow and pain which others who are persecuted may be enduring. Our souls must be tuned to the fragility of life. I am reminded of the wisdom expressed by a character in Judith Guest's novel, Ordinary People: "You gotta feel lousy sometimes in order to feel better."

Finally, Purim directs us to rephrase some important questions: for example, we shouldn't be asking ourselves why God permits evil and hatred in our world, but rather what can I do to prevent it? What can I do to alleviate suffering? Purim teaches us that the ultimate defense again Amalek and Haman is to participate in creating a just, moral, righteous society for all.

Dr. Robert Oppenheim, who supervised the development of then first atomic bomb, was asked, "Is there a defense against this dreadful weapon?" He responded, "Yes, there is – Peace".

May we all have a joy-filled and meaningful Purim. And may we be rewarded with the Megilah's prophecy: "Orah v'Simchah – Light and Gladness"! Shalom to all.

The BSTC Labyrinth, located on the northeast of the Temple, was built by the BSTC Brotherhood in October, 2018. The labyrinth was dedicated by newly hired Rabbi Norman Roman with the following blessing which can be found at the entrance to the labyrinth.

#### **BLESSING FOR THE LABYRINTH**

November 3, 2018 25 Heshvan, 5779

May it be Your will, Adonai our God and God of our ancestors, that You guide all of us safely on our journeys — be they through this Labyrinth in this Holy Place or anywhere in Your world — that You lead us on our paths in peace, and that You allow us to reach our desired destinations with a renewed appreciation for life, purpose and joy.

Protect us from all obstacles along our way, and bestow blessings on the work of our hands.

Grant hope, graciousness, lovingkindness and compassion to us, as well as to all whom we encounter along our way.

Blessed are You, Adonai, You watch over us on our journeys.

Some of the earliest forms of labyrinths are found in Greece, dating back to 2500-2000

B.C.E. Labyrinths are found throughout North America, Europe, North Africa, the Indian sub-continent and Indonesia. People from all corners of the globe have used labyrinths as a means of searching for guidance and promoting healing. Labyrinths can be found in hospitals, churches, temples, parks, and prisons. A Labyrinth is not a maze as there are no decisions to be made other than to enter or not.

The 28' diameter BSTC labyrinth is a six-circuit design, with seven rocked lines, based on the Jewish tradition of the seven walls around the city of Jericho. Congregation Kol Ami (CKA) in Flower Mound, Texas, uses a labyrinth as part of their Shabbat service and was built by a young congregant for his Eagle Scout project. (click here to discover more).



# Meet the Rabbi's Rabbis

Thursday, March 24, 2022 • 2 pm Rabbi Solomon Freehof (1892-1990)



Rabbi Solomon Freehof was the Senior Rabbi for generations at the Rodef Shalom Congregation in Pittsburgh. His legendary role as the most knowledgeable, prolific and respected writer of "Responsa" within the Reform/Liberal community was unquestioned, even by Rabbis of the other major streams of Jewish life.
