Treasurer's Message

As Treasurer of BSTC, I first would like to thank you for your past generosity. We couldn't have had a successful Torah Campaign or Gala event without you. However, I would like to have a heart-to-heart talk with you.

BSTC has been running at a deficit every year since I have been a member (six years) of between \$65,000 and \$75,000. The cost of everything has increased each year and the amount of the BSTC deficit also increased.

Currently our dues cover only slightly more than one -third of our expenses. To bridge the gap, we've relied on withdrawals from our brokerage account. While market gains have helped cushion these withdrawals, it is clear that if we continue on this path, BSTC will be bankrupt in 7 to 10 years.

The budget we have created for this year, while not an austerity budget, has been created with reality in mind. This year, we got the budget deficit down to \$57,000. We are used to a certain level of services that we don't want to eliminate. Supporting the building itself is not reducible – and our building is getting old so will require more upkeep than in the past.

Given that significant expense reductions are not feasible, we must look at ways to increase our income. We have raised the dues only twice in the last six years; by 20% and 12%. Our Bylaws say the Board can increase dues 20% each year without approval of the majority of the congregation. Therefore, raising dues will help a little, but not solve our problem

unless the congregation approves a major jump in dues. This is not desirable.

So what can we do?

- Grants. We have received grants for security purposes and High Holiday Expenses in the past. Forming a committee focused on this effort could yield meaningful results.
- Fundraisers. Our Dine and Laugh Gala raised over \$22,000 for which we are very grateful. Smaller events of the Program Committee have raised money. However, we need to increase both the frequency and scale of our fundraising events.
- Donations. Many of our members have donated, throughout the years, with Tributes, the Book of Remembrance listings, and other miscellaneous donations. Your support has been invaluable. Much of the money in our brokerage account has come from bequests a crucial safety net. However, we cannot and should not rely on bequests based on people dying and leaving us money.

The path forward:

A challenge we face is that many of our members are seasonal residents and remain committed to their synagogues 'back home' dividing their support. We understand and respect these ties, but ask you to also consider the importance of sustaining BSTC. Imagine if each of us contributed \$18 (or more) a few times each year – perhaps as a tribute in honor of a yahrzeit, the birth of a grandchild, or a milestone birthday or anniversary. These small, heartfelt donations would collectively make a significant impact on our synagogue's long-term stability.

We need your help. Together, through grants, fundraisers, and increased member support, we can secure the future of BSTC for generations to come.

Thank you for your continued dedication and generosity.

MESSAGE FROM RABBI NORM

The Jewish Election in 2025

Are you a Zionist? Do you believe that there needs to be a safe, democratic, pluralistic and strong State of Israel - and that Israel can serve as a significant, inspiring source of Jewish spirit, pride, innovation and hope throughout the Diaspora (the Jewish communities outside of the State)?

The World Zionist Congress (WZO), meeting every five years, is an elected body of delegates from Israel and the World, making important decisions and enacting policies that impact more than One Billion Dollars in spending. Although much of the financial disbursement is in Israel itself, the rest of the Jewish world benefits through education and direct services provided to metropolitan areas, institutions, support-agencies, and programs for Aliyah (immigration).

Since October 7, 2023 sadly, we have all seen how what happens in Eretz Yizrael impacts all of us. Anti-Semitism is at extremely high levels around the globe, and, in Israel itself, there are struggles to maintain the integrity and character of the Jewish soul in everyday living. The next chapters of Jewish history will be written in this decade - and we, even those of us in Green Valley, Arizona, can influence the story.

In my opinion (and the effort to which I will be dedicating my time and energy), we will need to support those delegate-slates that affirm our belief in Israel's democratic, pluralistic, and forward-looking core; that welcome equal rights for women, Jews by Choice, and LGBTQ persons; and provide proper funding, authenticity and recognition for Reform, Conservative, Reconstructionist and Renewal clergy and congregations.

The 39th "Parliament of the Jewish People" will be held in October 2025, but voting for delegates will be open March 10th - May 4th. To be eligible to vote in this campaign, you must be Jewish (under the definition of our Community), be at least 18 years of age, be a U.S. citizen or legal permanent U.S. resident, and affirm your commitment to the "Jerusalem Program" (cf *The Jerusalem Program* at the website www.arm.org). I will be leading a discussion of this and additional information about the World Zionist Congress in the Spring.

The fee to register and vote is \$5 per person, which

goes solely to cover the cost of the international election. Voting will be done primarily online but paper ballots will be available by request.

Please watch for additional details, and I will share important updates as the Election itself approaches. If you are so moved and wish to help me in coordinating a larger turnout or recruiting others to vote as well, please let me know!

Praying for Shalom 'Al Yisrael.

For every act of darkness, a lamp kindled by those who remember, who refuse to let hate claim

even a corner of what is sacredly kept.

And so I, too, hold that eternal light, carry it forward—

a flame shared, a promise unbroken, through a voice that chooses

to face the dark and stand.

Gloria Etta Clancy



Gloria Etta Clancy, a beloved member and Past President of the Beth Shalom Temple Center, and a devoted advocate for others, passed away peacefully on Sunday, January 12, 2025, at the age of 85.

Born on March 10, 1939, Gloria spent her life caring for those in need. As a pediatric nurse practitioner specializing in neonatal intensive care, she brought expert care and compassion to countless families during their most critical moments. Her work in the NICU saved and shaped lives, reflecting her profound dedication to nurturing others.

Gloria's contributions to Beth Shalom Temple Center were equally impactful. A long-time member, she served as temple president, an active board member, and our dedicated historian, preserving the rich legacy of our community. Her commitment to service was unwavering—Gloria was even running for re-election to the temple board, determined to help guide our future.

Despite her illness, Gloria actively participated in temple life. She rehearsed enthusiastically for this year's Hanukkah Spiel and regularly visited the library to organize historical photographs, preserving our shared history. Though she was unable to perform in the Spiel, her love for the temple shone brightly in all she did. Gloria's enthusiasm, leadership, and selflessness were an inspiration to us all.

Gloria is survived by her devoted husband, Tom Clancy, and their family in Green Valley, who brought her immense pride and joy.

MEN'S CLUB


- The Men's Club meets at El Patio Restaurant at 9am on the second Wednesday of each month.
