TEMPLE TIDINGS

Leadership Search

Originally the Leadership Search Committee wanted to release the following information as a handout at the Special Congregational Meeting on December 23rd, but based upon the questions that have been asked it was decided to be released 10 days earlier.

Reasons to hire a permanent leader to conduct services at Beth Shalom Temple Center:

1. Many of our members would like to add a regularly scheduled Saturday morning service to our twice monthly Friday night services.
 - A. Some of our members can no longer drive at night but still wish to attend a BSTC religious service.
 - B. Many of our members prefer the Saturday morning service as it includes the Torah Service, to the Friday night service which does not.
2. As those members who have been leading services get older and/or move away it has been increasingly difficult to obtain new leaders. Eventually we will not be able to conduct Shabbat services.
3. Consistency of services. Members prefer the use of familiar melodies. Having multiple leaders leads itself to the use of unfamiliar melodies.

Members also like a consistency in the prayers that are being said, and the order in which they are said.

Reasons this leader should be an ordained professional:

Specialized workshops and adult educational programming focused on the needs of BSTC members and the public. Options include, but are not limited to:

- A. Hebrew classes for those wanting to learn or refresh.
- B. Exploration of many of the writings not included in the Torah. Current writings could also be studied.
- C. Discussions of comparative religions/Jewish understanding of the New Testament and Koran.
- D. Jewish Life Cycle
- E. 21st Century North American Jewish Community
- F. Jewish Responses to contemporary problems
- G. Improve BSTC's standing within the Southern Arizona religious community, both Jewish and non-Jewish.
- H. Provide life cycle and counseling services to our members. Our members should not need (unless they want to) to obtain these services from non-Jewish clergy.
- I. Increase in membership as baby boomers continue to move into the area and are accustomed to having an ordained leader.

The Ritual Committee/Leadership Search Committee along with the BSTC Board is recommending the hiring of Rabbi Norman Roman to fill our needs. Rabbi Roman has over 30 years experience as a rabbi. He has also served as an adjunct instructor in Religious Studies and has worked through the Jewish Federation of Metro Detroit.

Rabbi Roman will officially begin his service to BSTC on January 1, 2020 on a one year trial basis. He will work on a part-time basis. BSTC has made a commitment to Michael and Sara Mussman for 2019, and will honor it (we are also discussing doing something for the Mussmans to show our appreciation for all they have done). Rabbi Roman also has made commitments to other organizations that he must honor.

Rabbi Roman and his wife, Lynn, currently are planning to move to the Green Valley area in early September 2019. Any work Rabbi Roman does for BSTC in 2019 will be paid on a per diem basis. BSTC has applied for a grant from the Jewish Community Foundation to cover this.

Sunday, December 23rd, BSTC will hold a special congregational meeting. The purpose of this meeting is for membership to authorize the BSTC Board of Directors to hire Rabbi Roman. All members have been invited, and are encouraged to attend. Any questions please contact Ruthann Shapiro or Merle Sobol.
