Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

Dear Friends,

My plan is to introduce you to four Rabbis who, directly or indirectly, have influenced me and the classically-inspired, yet progressive Judaism which I practice and teach. We'll read some of their works, try to understand their roles in the development of our contemporary Jewish experience, and (probably) debate some of their insights and achievements.

(February 24) Rabbi Eliezer Papo, 1785-1828, was a leader and scholar of the *Musar* movement, which taught ethics and moral guidance within the context of traditional religious law. He was also the Chief Sephardic Rabbi of Bulgaria, and quite a few of his descendants or distant relatives – like me! – also became Rabbis. I mentioned Papo and his work on Yom Kippur, last September.

(March 24) Rabbi Solomon Freehof, 1892-1990, was the Senior Rabbi for generations at the Rodef Shalom Congregation in Pittsburgh. His legendary role as the most knowledgeable, prolific and respected writer of "Responsa" within the Reform/Liberal community was unquestioned, even by Rabbis of the

other major streams of Jewish life. In many ways, Freehof's answers to practical questions shaped the Religious practice we in the 20th and 21st century know and observe.

(April 28) Rabbi Leo Baeck, 1873-1956. As we commemorate Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Memorial Day), we will examine the teachings of the man who was known as the "Rabbi of Theresienstadt". Formerly the honorary head of the Berlin Jewish Community, Baeck served his people through the Nazi years, surviving to ultimately teach at the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati and become the President of the World Union of Progressive Judaism, based in London. His writings about the relationship between Judaism and Christianity may be controversial to some, but it is inspirational to others.

(May 26) Rabbi Sally Priesand, 1946-present, is the first female Rabbi ordained by a recognized Seminary, and the second formally ordained woman Rabbi in history. Born in Cleveland (very significant to know for BSTC purposes!), she was ordained 50 years ago in Cincinnati. Women's roles in every corner of the Jewish world will never be the same, following her courageous and determined steps toward equality.

I look forward to studying these Rabbis, and their importance to our Jewish identities, with you! Shalom,


