President's Message

It's been a long time coming and I'm hoping that this will be one of the last times I need to write about the status of BSTC and Covid. Unfortunately I still need to remind people that we are asking only vaccinated people to attend events in person at the Temple. Also remember that just because someone is not wearing a mask you can not assume that they are fully vaccinated (not so much with our members but we do get visitors).

A few things did change since the July Shofar was sent out.

- 1. We were unable to resume normal office hours in July. They are now scheduled to begin August 2. The BSTC office will be open Monday & Friday 10:00am-2:00pm and Wednesday 12:00pm-4:00pm.
- 2. Full Shabbat Onegs will resume in October. We will have wine and challah in August.
- 3. The arrangement of chairs in the Sanctuary has not changed but everyone is welcome to move chairs as needed. Social distancing need not be retained.
- 4. The tables have not been put up. In person meetings/movies/services are now being held as long as everyone in attendance is fully vaccinated. For those not fully vaccinated or who want to remain at home we will continue to use Zoom and YouTube. You may need to preregister for a Zoom invitation to be sent.

Our goal is still to be back to "normal" by October 1st.

Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

THE MONTH OF PREPARATION

We are only a few days more than one month before Rosh HaShana – the new year of 5782. We reflect back on the year just passed (with its lows and highs), and pray for much in our lives to be better soon; actually, we pray that we will make ourselves better in the new year . . .

The Hebrew name for this, the 6th month of the lunar-calendar year (don't be confused: Rosh HaShana and Yom Kippur are observed in the 7th month) is Elul. In many communities, the Shofar is sounded daily, except on Shabbat, and penitential prayers, referred to as Selichot, are recited with deep sincerity. Traditions abound – among families and communities, for observing the unique character of this period and ushering in the High Holy Days, also called the Ten Days of Repentance or the Ten Days of Awe.

OUR MOST FERVENT PRAYER FOR ELUL THIS YEAR IS, OF COURSE, THAT ALL OF US WILL BE HEALTHY ENOUGH AND ABLE TO GATHER TOGETHER IN PERSON, WELCOMING EACH OTHER AND THE HOLY DAYS WITH SMILES, HUGS, AND OTHER DEMONSTRATIONS OF OUR JOY!

But I wanted to share with you several readings (found in the <u>Shaarei Teshuvah – Gates of Repentance</u> Machzor of the Central Conference of American Rabbis) which I attempt to study in Elul every year, as I prepare myself once again for the Worship Services and inspiration of our Congregation:

The Ten Commandments

part of it, in time without stop as a segment of it. Space and time are fundamentally one here, they come from the one, omnipresent, eternal God.

World and eternity are here one word ('Olam), both signify the same unendingness. We live in this unendingness, and from it. Our domain is the opposite of mere location, of that which has boundary and written description. Our day is the opposite of finality, of fate. Our domain is a going outward that points to the faraway, our day is the direction that leads into the distance.

All that has come into existence and has been given becomes a path to the beyond, and to that which is in the process of becoming, to the world beyond and to the coming day. All creation wants to be revelation, all of the past becomes the future.

This fragile life between birth and death can nevertheless be a fulfillment – if it is a dialogue. In our life and experience we are addressed; by thought and speech and action, by producing and influencing we are able to answer. For the most part we do not listen to the address, or we break into it with chatter. But if the world comes to us and the answer proceeds from us, then human life exists, though brokenly, in the world. The kindling of the response is that 'spark' of the soul, the blazing up of the response, which occurs time and again, to the unexpectedly approaching speech, we term responsibility . . . (Martin Buber)

From year to year the need becomes more urgent for a religion that teaches reverence for life as its highest principle. Judaism is such a religion. The God it worships does not desire the death of sinners, but that they may turn and live. That God's word is "Seek Me and live" and "Choose Life!" It is a religion which teaches that to destroy a single life is to destroy an entire world, and to sustain a single life is to sustain an entire world. It is a religion that yearns, above all things, for the day when swords will be beaten into plowshares and spears into pruning hooks; whose toast is "L'Chaim – To Life!"

It is a religion whose New Year is a celebration of, life and a plea for its continuance: "Remember us unto Life, O King Who delights in life, and inscribe us in the Book of Life, for Your sake, O God of life".

SOCIAL ACTION


No meetings will be held June-August.
