- Friday, July 2nd we will resume Challah & wine at religious services. Full Onegs and Kiddush luncheons will be added in August.

- Thursday, September 16th Break The Fast
- Sunday, October 3rd Bagel Breakfast

In person meetings may resume at any time as long as everyone is fully vaccinated. Hybrid meetings can be arranged.

Currently the sanctuary is set up for social distancing. This will be removed by July so that the tables can once again be put in place.

HOSPITALITY

The Hospitality Committee is happy to announce that food events will begin again at BSTC. See the President's message on the front page for details!

The Hospitality Committee has provided a new procedure guide for anybody using the BSTC kitchen:

Kitchen guidelines at BSTC

Below is what we expect from anyone using the kitchen (in no particular order):

- All items used returned to where it was taken from clean and dry.
- Sinks rinsed and clear of any debris. Garbage disposal run if necessary. Check sinks AFTER the water has drained.
- Floors mopped (when Temple is not scheduled to be cleaned within 24 hrs); all counters cleaned (move anything on counters for cleaning. Small items such as flour, sugar and seeds tend to disperse and can be found in areas not used) and wiped down with sanitizer (a solution of 1 tablespoon bleach and 1 gallon of water). Let air dry. Bleach is under the counter between the sink and the dishwasher. More in the shed on the floor – straight ahead where the janitorial

items are.

- Garbage taken out to the dumpster outside the outer door from the sanctuary (take garbage home until BSTC reinstates garbage pickup) and new trash bags placed in cans. There are usually more black bags on the right side under the sink by the door. If none there, there are some in the shed on the floor -- straight ahead where the janitorial items are.
- Towels and aprons taken home to be washed and returned. Clean towels will be found under the sink by the door, on the left side.
- If the shed is opened, close and lock it. Key is on a red hook kept on the stand next to the back door.
- Be sure the back door has closed completely, or the alarm system will indicate that a door is open.
- If you use the stove/oven, be sure to turn the gas OFF.
