President's Message

Since we are all Goodwill Ambassadors for Beth Shalom Temple Center, I urge you to share this with your non-affiliated Jewish friends and neighbors.

Last year BSTC offered no cost, High Holiday tickets to non-affiliated residents via an invitation in our local newspaper. As a result, we doubled the attendance of the 2016 High Holiday Services and added approximately 15 members.

Thanks to the AZ Jewish Federation for sharing their mailing list, we are now about to send this invitation to about 450 Jewish residents living south of Tucson.

If you are not affiliated with a synagogue, we welcome you to join us for the High Holiday services at no charge. If you ever thought about joining a synagogue, but haven't, please stop by. We would love to meet you and tell you about our BSTC family.

We invite you to join with us as we walk together in search of meaning and spiritual fulfillment in our lives. Come and help us make the Beth Shalom Temple Center family into a true "covenant community" - a place where individuals are valued and respected, where we share our joys and our heartaches together freely, celebrate the milestones of our Jewish calendar and our lives together, teach our children and grandchildren (and ourselves) of the beauty and value of Jewish traditions, and work together to make Jewish life, and life in the larger community, more fulfilling for all.

I would like to share a story I recently read about an angry reader who stormed into the newspaper office demanding to see the person who wrote the obituary column. He was referring to a young reporter to whom he showed the column which included his own obituary. He yelled, "as you can see, I am very much alive. I demand a retraction.!" The reporter replied, "I never retract a story, but I will tell you what I will do. I will put you in the birth column next issue and give you a fresh start!"

Judaism places a great deal of emphasis on the importance of getting a fresh start. At our Shabbat service, for example, we include a special prayer that we might begin the coming week in peace and tranquility. The first day of each new Hebrew month is celebrated as a semi-holiday, with a special plea that G-d fill the new month with every form of happiness and blessing.

The older I get, the better I understand that it's really up to each of us. As it says in the Talmud, "Who is rich? One who is satisfied with their portion in life." Are we waiting for something special before we change our ways? Are we waiting for some big payday? What will we tell ourselves when our time has come? Will we say, I should have spent more time at my job or I should have spent more money, or I should have been more supportive of my synagogue, or even, I should have spent more time with my family?

No one sets our priorities except ourselves, and as long as we do it now, it will never be too late for a fresh start. You may have heard that the synagogue affiliation is down across the country. There are Jewish organizations however, that are examining their strengths; building on those strengths; and, in doing so, marketing themselves effectively to increase their membership.

Tisha B'Av/ The 9th of Av-- a Day of Mourning and Hope

Tisha B'Av commemorates the destruction of the first and second Temples, both of which were destroyed on the 9th of Av (the first by the Babylonians and the second by the Romans in 70 C.E.)

While primarily meant to memorialize the Temple destructions, there are many other tragedies occurring on this day including the expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492 and from England in 1290.

Tisha B'Av continued

Traditional Jews observe *Tisha b'Av* by fasting and other practices observed on Yom Kippur. People who are ill, as with Yom Kippur, need not fast. In the Synagogue the book of Lamentations is read and mourning prayers recited.

When the 9th of Av falls on a Saturday as it does this year, the fast is postponed until the 10th of Av.
