

President's Message

Sometimes I feel like a broken record stuck on Covid. For the past year it seems all my messages to you have been based one way or another on our attempt to keep BSTC active in light of our not being able to conduct normal BSTC activities.

Many of you have been asking now that the vaccine is available when we will be able to open the Temple. As I have explained to these people, Rabbi Roman has requested extremely limited attendance until he is able to be vaccinated in early May. As you will see in the Ritual Committee report, we hope to allow in person attendance in June.

According to CDC guidelines, small groups can now gather so long as social distancing is maintained. That is a problem in our building. The library and lobby tables are not big enough for more than 4-6 people and, while the sanctuary is big enough, I know from experience that holding a conversation with people at multiple tables is impossible.

The next question asked concerns Bagel Breakfast and other functions where food is served. Once again, we must follow CDC guidelines which still require masks to be worn. I haven't figured out how to eat with a mask on.



In the meantime, we will just need to keep going as we have been. Hopefully there is light at the end of this very long tunnel.

Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

By the time that most of you will be reading this, the Passover Festival for 5771 (our second during these trying Pandemic times) will have begun. As everyone knows, this holiday is a time for asking questions. There are classic, formalized queries of the Haggadah which we recited at our Seder tables - whether in person, recorded or on Zoom. There are the "how are you?' and "what's new?" discussions with those whom we have not been with in a while (again, whether in person, recorded or on Zoom). There are the family's debates over recipes, melodies, afikoman hiding places, and one's individual preference for hard or soft Matzah balls. There are the tests of knowledge which parents and grandparents devise to display their children's knowledge in the presence of all who might listen . . .

Yet there are also more profound questions which can and should be posed in our families and community at Pesach time, despite the additional burden we have of coping with COVID and its impact upon us. For this a season to ask questions about our commitment, understanding, and hope for the Jewish future. Indeed, they are questions to be asked and answered throughout the year.

The Torah tells us that our children will ask us about the meaning of Passover: "What does this ritual mean to you?" The Rabbis consider this and give us various suggestions for their era and modes of education. But the questions persist – each generation asking, if not demanding, again and again – Why? They want to know and relate to the very foundations of Jewish life. And if we truly accept the commandment to relive the Exodus "from each generation to generation",

then we must continue the discussion of what Exodus, Freedom, Faith, and Judaism mean to us.

Having read the Haggadah once again, we are all familiar with the description of four types of children/students. The Talmud counsels: "The parent must teach each child according to his/her level of understanding". And we also need to recognize that there are four types of Jewish parents/teachers, as well: the wise, the wicked, the superficial, and the one who does not know how to reply.

Passover time, the season of our freedom from slavery, our independence as a people, and the celebration of Spring, redemption, and renewal, is the ideal time for us as community leaders, parents and grandparents to ensure that we have our responses to the questions asked of us: are we doing enough to support Jewish life? Are we participating and learning and teaching enough? What can we be doing better – as spouses, family members, friends?

May the questions, answers, songs, prayers, recipes, and symbols of Pesach give us all renewed hope and confidence, especially this year! Chag Sameach!

PROGRAMS—ZOOM IN

Wednesdays at BSTC

Temple member Bev Lake made a presentation on an archeological dig she was on the last couple of years in North Dakota. If you could not attend, the presentation is posted on our YouTube channel, which can be accessed via the BSTC website. As a reminder: most of the services, classes, presentations and studies from late April 2020 through the present are now on-line and can be found by clicking on the "Please click HERE for the videos" link on the BSTC website. They are normally posted on-line within 24 hours of the event.



Planned for **Wednesday, May 19th** is a presentation by BSTC member Don Berk that correlates catastrophic events in the Tenach (Genesis and Exodus) with historical solar eruptions. There is strong evidence that the sun as a variable star enters a "nova" stage about every 12,000 years with intermediate lesser flare-ups that can have drastic impacts on the planet. Topics for future programs include speakers on the upcoming Israeli election; on Jewish themes in the Folk Music of the 60s and 70s; on Jewish history; and on Islam.
