Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

"This Year in Jerusalem?"

Israel's national anthem is called "HaTikvah – The Hope", isn't it? Indeed, the lyric's theme is that the hope and dream of Jews everywhere will affirm the reality of "a free people in our own land". As we enter the secular new year of 2021, I invite you to join me in not only dreaming of, but hopefully planning for, a visit to Eretz Yisrael.

We are all cautiously optimistic that the Spring and Summer will bring us respite and relief from the terrible Covid-19 Pandemic which we have been enduring. As I write these words, the first American citizens, and residents of quite a few countries internationally, are receiving their initial vaccine doses. Reports are that it will still be several months before most of us will be able to adjust to a renewed normal - but recover we will, and adjust we will! Our Jewish heritage and history are filled with examples of how we as a People refuse to despair, and of how we find the courage, if not the chutzpah, to emerge from the darkness into bright, reassuring light.

With this in mind, my contacts in Jerusalem and I have begun planning for the possibility of Lynne and me leading a tour group to Israel in November, 2021 – God willing, after travel and safety conditions return to the appropriate conditions (the Ministry of Tourism is suggesting that the Country will confidently welcome tourists in larger numbers in time for the High Holy Days in September). There are, of course, no guarantees ... but for those who might be seriously interested in the idea, now is the time to begin discussing, if not even clearing some dates on our calendars.

Proposed dates: between November 7 and 23.

What type of tour: for adults of Jewish or non-Jewish background (in other words, the itinerary will be respectful of Jewish, Christian and Moslem sites), whether firsttimers or those who have been to Israel previously. (Continued on page 4)

The trip includes 10-11 nights traveling in Israel, with an optional 2-3 night extension to Petra, Jordan.

How much: I just can't predict, yet, what the cost will be. Circumstances and how quickly the travel/tourism industry rebounds will affect the bottom line. But once we have some idea of how many folks (from around here, and/or your and our friends and family from all over) are thinking of joining us, it will help provide a first indication of how we can plan. I do know, however, that round-trip economy airfares for next Fall are in the \$850-1,000 range, and most of the major airlines are now making their fares refundable.

So, please – think about it. Dream about it! Entertain the "Hope" that you and I will say our Shehechiyanu prayers in the Holy Land.

In my 45 years of serving as a Rabbi, there are very few moments as inspirational and meaningful as accompanying people, of any age, and welcoming them "home" to Israel. Will you join me?
