Wednesday Afternoons at BSTC

The committee recently met to plan movies, presentations and other programs for the coming months, scheduling most of them on Wednesdays at 1 p.m.

Topics of future programs include speakers on the upcoming Israeli election; on Jewish Themes in Folk Music of the 60s and 70s; on Jewish history; on Islam; and on archeology. Movies being considered











include: Paper Clips, Not in Our Town, A Long Journey, the Hidden Jews of the Southwest, and Outback Rabbi.

MOVIES ON ZOOM

"Paper Clips" will be screened on Wednesday, March 17th at 1 pm, courtesy of BSTC member Larry Gravitz. A review of this gem of a documentary from 2004 states "it began as a lesson about prejudice...what happened was a miracle".

This video shows how a principal, a teacher, and a small town can transform themselves and send an impactful message far beyond its borders. Whitwell, Tennessee is a former coal mining town of 1600 people who are almost all white and Protestant. The

principal of the middle school felt that her student's insular isolation would disadvantage them when they engaged with the wider world.

She set up an after school project to teach about intolerance and the Holocaust. A major challenge for the teacher was how to enable her students to grasp the concept of six million. The class decided to collect six million paper clips.

Paper clips were cheap, widely available, and symbolic. During the war, paper clips were worn by non-Jewish Norwegians as a sign of protest.

This well crafted documentary will give you renewed hope in today's youth and reinforce our belief in why the Holocaust must no be forgotten.

Continuing Projects:

- Provide 100 more motivational quotes to the YOTO program students in February.
- Collection of non-perishable food items and money donations will continue until all our congregation members feel safe to attend regular activities and services. February 11th food collected equaled 43.6 pounds plus \$118 in monetary donations. February 25th collected more, and donations were split between the Green Valley and Sahuarita food banks.

Planning will soon begin for donation collections for the student school supplies for Sopori Elementary School in Amado for their 2021-22 school year. The BSTC Brotherhood donated \$400 from the last bagel fundraiser to this good cause, seeing us already 40% closer to our annual \$1000 goal. THANK YOU!

Other Social Action Activities:

- Larry Gravitz continues to work with the A4a Immigration Action Team and keeping our community informed on immigration issues and finding ways we can all become more involved in working on resolving immigrant problems.
- Monthly food donation drop-off days at BSTC will continue until all congregation members are safe to attend regular Friday evening and Saturday morning Shabbat services, and normal activities are held again.
- The Social Action committee is sponsoring three social action documentaries for the upcoming "Wednesday Afternoons at BSTC".
- The committee also recently made a connection with the GVR Woodworkers Club to identify needy school children in our area for their donation of 30 school desks for use at home.
 We are coordinating with the Continental and Sahuarita school districts to identify appropriate recipients.

The Social Action Committee wishes all BSTC members to stay positive, get their vaccinations as soon as possible, and stay healthy!
