President's Message

Do you get the Green Valley News? Sid and I do. Some weeks it has lots of news and sometimes it's just a lot of advertising. There are two things in which it is consistent: Sunday's comics and Wednesday's church ads. I find myself drawn to both. Why you may ask. Well the Sunday comics are kind of obvious. They give us an escape from the reality around us. Everyone needs a break especially now with so much negative in the world but the church ads. Well the church ads lead us to the old adage "misery loves company". Since we closed in March, I've been watching these ads to see how other religious organizations were handling being closed.

For the first six months it was pretty much consistent with everyone closed and using either Zoom or streaming for their worship services. Recently though many have started to reopen. That started me thinking when and how BSTC can reopen.

The High Holy Days gave me the answer. In configuring the sanctuary so that it could accommodate 20 people I discovered that we can hold services and still maintain social distancing. After discussing this with the rest of the Board it was decided that **as of October 2, BSTC can safely reopen for services only.** Masks will still be required. There will be no food or drink served so no Onegs or Kiddish luncheons. Services will continue to be streamed via YouTube *Live* so that those who are still uncomfortable with in person services can still be a part while staying apart.

No timetable has been set for the resumption of Bagel Breakfast or in person meetings/events. We

MOVIES ON ZOOM

Following successful movie showings via Zoom, the BSTC Programs Committee has started scheduling Jewish themed movies for members to watch from the comfort of their own homes. On September 23rd at 1 pm, "**The Jewish Journey: America**" explored what it meant to be part of a tight-knit Jewish community and make the heartbreaking choice to leave family behind, whether for economic opportunity or to escape persecution. Incredible archive of photographs

and footage bring to life the personal stories of first to fourth generation Americans who took a leap of faith and made it to America however they could.

This month, on two successive Wednesdays, **October 14th and October 21st at 1 pm**, we will show "**The Jewish Americans**" by acclaimed filmmaker David Grubin which traces 350 years of Jewish American history, from the arrival of the first Jews in 1654 up to present day. This story tells of the struggle of a tiny minority to make their way into the American mainstream while at the same time maintaining a sense of their own identity as Jews. Focusing on the tension between identity and assimilation, it is a quintessentially American story, which other minority groups will find surprisingly familiar.
