

PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

Tu B'Shevat Seder and Celebration

A vegetarian or dairy potluck dinner is the plan once again for celebrating *Tu B'Shevat* (the 15th day of the Jewish month, Shevat), The holiday honors the trees growing in Israel and marks the season in which the earliest-blooming trees appear after their dormant period and begin a new fruit-bearing cycle. The festival is similar to Arbor Day. *Tu B'Shevat Seder and Celebration continued...*

On **Sunday**, **February 12 at 4 p.m**. Steve Maron will lead the *Tu B"Shevat Seder* followed by the potluck dinner at 5 p.m.

Customarily, Jews try to eat a new, seasonal fruit or try to eat from the Seven Species (*shivat hamanim*) described in the bible as being abundant in Israel - a land of wheat, barley, grapes (vines), figs, pomegranates; olives and dates (honey) (Deuteronomy 8.8)."

Tu B'Shevat Celebration continued...

Eating carob, or St John's bread, a pod originally native to the Middle East and containing a sweet, edible pulp and inedible seed is a common custom as well. Growing up this was a popular treat for me and we called it buchsar (sp?). Does anyone else remember eating this for Tu B'Shevat or calling it by that name? Let me know.

Another custom is to plant trees or to collect money for trees to be planted in Israel.

For BSTC's celebration, please bring a VEGETARIAN or DAIRY dish (no meat or any marshmallow ingredients), as well as nuts, raisons, or grapes or any newly ripened fruit that one has not yet eaten during 2017. Suggested drinks to bring are wine or grape juice, or fruit juice, soda, water or seltzer. *Linda Stein*

Visiting Your Roots

Since December 9, 2016 and running until February 15, 2017, the Art Gallery is presenting "Visiting Your Roots" an exhibition featuring photographs and pamphlets from recent trips to Austria, the Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary and Poland. The photographs highlight "Memorials, Camps, Synagogues and Museums" taken by members, family and friends of BSTC.

Visitors to the exhibit are invited to place various colored pushpins on a large map of the areas to identify the country from which their families originated.

A reception for the exhibit will be held on **Sunday, January 8, 2017 at 2 p.m.**, with the noted historian Dr. David Graizbord as guest speaker. Dr. Graizboard is an Associate Professor in Judaic Studies at the University of Arizona and The Arizona Center for Judaic Studies. His special interests are Modern Jewish History, History of Anti-Semitism as well as Jewish Identify. He is also a noted scholar on "New Christians" also known as Converso Jews.

For this exhibit, Dr. Graizbord will be speaking on "Blooming? Where We are Planted" – a look at how Jews continue to enrich the eastern European countries in face of the many newly emerging challenges.
