I also had a board and committee chairs who held BSTC in their hearts the same as me, and I also had Stacy in the office holding everything together.

Then Covid 19 hit the United States. At first it seemed that Arizona in general and Green Valley/Sahuarita in particular would be spared this horrible disease. Then I started to see more and more local religious organizations closing their doors. With Passover fast approaching it was decided to close BSTC as well. In the meantime, Merle came up with the idea that we could tape both our services and a mock Seder and post to our website. With the help of Les Bakke (and his equipment) Rabbi Roman did a remarkable job (you can still see them on our YouTube page).

Meetings, activities and classes moved to Zoom while services were streamed via YouTube Live. #### "Leadership Advice from an Unexpected Source"

You may not be aware that the name of the Torah portion which contains the Ten Commandments doesn't reflect the name of God, nor Israel; rather it is entitled "Jethro", referring to Moses' father-in-law, a Midianite priest. He was a fascinating character, to be sure, but worthy of this honor? An honor not even given anywhere in the Torah to Moses himself? Nor to any of the patriarchs and only one of the Matriarchs?

Throughout the years, and especially when our attention has been turned to questions of communal or national leadership, power and authority, I've frequently come back to look at some of the traditional Jewish studies about Jethro and Moses. One of the most insightful to me is found in the essays of Rabbi

I also want the thank you for paying your 2021 dues. I hope we can count on you again in 2021 so that BSTC can continue to meet the social, religious and educational needs of the Green Valley/Sahuarita Jewish community.

#### Message from Rabbi Norm Roman (continued)

Mordecai Schultz of the Hebrew Theological College: Jethro was an unusual man, distinguished in the Torah as the only Gentile friend of the Israelites after the Exodus. According to at least one ancient Rabbi, Jethro even converted to Judaism, and along with Ruth, serves as a role model for those who willingly join our faith community. But we learn more about

him from the text, including the fact that his name was changed. It originally was Yeter, but when it was recognized that he was a man of sincerity and good deeds, another letter was added to his name, the Hebrew letter Vav, and he was forever known at Yitro. (Thus he joined with others in the Bible whose names were also changed after their performance of good deeds or their acceptance of God's covenant.) And the choice of the additional letter Vav is what intrigued Rabbis Schultz, and what I suggest provides lessons for us, now, as well.

The first function of the letter Vav is to add – the word "and", if you will. Jethro not only provided a refuge for Moses when he fled from the Pharoah in Egypt, but he welcomed him into his home and family. "And" signified the welcoming and including of someone new, with a different background and new ideas, if not new goals. Jethro adds to his original kindnesses with gestures of encouragement and support, for his new son-in-law and the Israelites. The second role of the Hebrew letter *Vav added to* Jethro's name may not be as well known to many; it is called the "converse" letter, because it changes the tenses in Biblical grammar (verbs written in the past tense must be understood in the future, and vice versa). Jethro, a proven leader, suggested a significant change to Moses, i.e. rather than patterning after the Pharoah as an authoritarian ruler, Moses should trust in his people to participate in their own 'government'. Moses shouldn't assume all of the responsibility on his own shoulders – no man, no matter how wise or energetic or arrogant, could bear the burden on his own. Jethro told Moses to delegate authority, finding representatives who would be reverent, honest and just., It was to be a major change in tense and tone . . .,

And finally, Dr. Schultz' message is that the third positioning of the letter Vav is to serve as a conjunction, uniting and holding together various parts of a sentence. Jethro wisely reunited Moses with his wife, Zipporah, and their children, at the very outset of their journey through the wilderness. Jethro reminded Moses that, before he could teach the people of their God and the Torah, he had to have family unity and harmony. He needed to respect their different backgrounds and experiences, ages and means of their coming to join the nation, in order to face the awe-filled future.

We would not have these principles, these founda-

tional values, preparing Moses and the Children of Israel for accepting the Ten Commandments, if were not for Jethro. He challenged them, and he challenges us in 2021 as well, to add to the good deeds of the past, to welcome change, and to always seek and respect unity.

#### **MEN'S CLUB**

The Men's Club met January 13th via Zoom with 10 members attending. Next meeting is on February 10th as we continue virtually due to our continued commitment to caution during this pandemic.

Major event changes with current status:

- The Gaslight Theatre event. Mike Finkelstein is fully refunding members who request it, others remain signed up for a show sometime in 2021.
- The Roads Scholar trip has been rescheduled to September 19-25, 2021. Many who were going on the original trip have rescheduled for the new dates. The Men's Club will re-publicize this event in a couple of months for new members who may want to attend. Contact Gary Friedman for information.
- Rabbi Roman has proposed a trip to Israel in the October-November 2021 time frame. More information will be published when dates can be finalized and the virus situation is clarified.

#### Completed projects:

Lenny Friedman's proposed purchase and donation of a large commercial dough mixer to BSTC has been completed. The BSTC Hospitality Committee approved of the equipment donation and the BSTC Board of Directors accepted the donation. The mixer cost approximately \$1007.00.



Men's Club members, under Lenny's leadership, tested the new mixer and recently serviced oven over the weekend of January 9-10 and then on the weekend of January 16-17 completed the community Bagel Sale. All bagel preparations were conducted without any significant problems and approximately 480 bagels were made. Our current records show that 39.5 dozen bagels were sold, raising approximately \$397 and, including donations, received about \$499. After all costs are deducted from the sale revenue, the remaining money will be donated evenly between the Sahuarita Community Food Bank and the Green Valley Southern Arizona Community Food Bank. This is the second very



successful bagel sale the Men's Club has conducted for our community.

Projects in process:

- In late January, the Men's Club will support its third BSTC outside area cleanup work party.
   This morning cleanup work will mainly consist of raking and sweeping waste around the BSTC outdoor areas.
- Future plans are to conduct a Men's Club bagel fundraising sale the third weekend of each month.
- Effective January 25th there will be a couple of leadership changes in the Men's Club. Gary Melton is stepping down as President to join the BSTC Board of Directors. In keeping in compli-

ance with the Men's Club Bylaws, Gary has appointed Lenny Friedman to take the position, and Lenny is appointing David Wyte to take over his current position as Secretary. Again, in compliance with our Bylaws, in January-February 2022, the Men's Club will conduct their general biennial elections, which occur only in even numbered years.

Mike Finkelstein will be offering some background, based on a talk he gave at a BSTC Shabbat a number of years back about Jewish historical migrations to China.
