#### Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

Dear Friends,

I have fallen into a pattern, over the last several years, of re-reading and studying the classic text Pirkei Avot (Ethics of the Fathers) in the Springtime. You might be familiar with some of its teachings or quotations, which have entered the liturgy of our Worship Services and the songs we sing, especially when honoring the Torah. You also might know that it is traditional to turn to this section of the Mishnah for guidance between the Festivals of Pesach and Shavuot.

One of the greatest Jewish teachings discussed in the six Chapters of <u>Pirkei Avot</u> is the concept of "Derech Eretz" – let's translate that phrase as "the proper way". It instructs each of us in how to live, in community with others. It reminds us that loyalty and faith are only some of the truest indicators of a person's "goodness". The proper way of living also includes honesty and integrity and tolerance and respect. Indeed, in the minds of some of the Rabbis, the latter characteristics and behaviors outweigh the former.

Sadly, the pushing-aside of "Derech Eretz" has become more and more prevalent in our civil society, and even in our Jewish communities. In-person, face-to-face, on-line, or in the written-word, things are said (whether true or not isn't even the issue!) and forwarded on or responded to without much thought of what the consequences might be, or who might be effected. I am horrified at some of the insults, accusations and even threats which I read almost daily; quite a few of you have brought to my attention uncomfortable moments and conversations held in the Temple, a place of dignity, acceptance and peace. 
With this in mind, permit me to share some other important lessons from this magnificent collection:

Rabbi Yehudah HaNasi was fond of saying: "Which is the proper path [of life] that one should select? The one that brings honor for oneself and brings honor to others . . . Think deeply about three things and you will never be gripped by the desire to commit a transgression [of hurting others]. Know what is above you — an eye that sees, and ear that hears, and all your deeds are inscribed in a book."

Hillel would say: "In a place where there are no human beings (i.e. "mensch"-like people), try to be one!"

#### **BOOK REVIEW**

**Sons and Soldiers** by Bruce Henderson is a fascinating story based on true, formerly unknown, events during WWII.

A group of young Jewish boys had escaped from Nazi occupied Europe and settled comfortably in the United States, but as young men they were determined to return to Germany to fight the Nazis. These Ritchie Boys, as they were known from their training camp in Maryland, knew that they had special abilities. The story relates how their knowledge of the German language and psychology were invaluable in infiltrating the enemy and obtaining information about troop movements, defenses, and other intelligence for the allies. Papers discovered after the war noted that over 60% of valuable intelligence obtained during the war came from these Ritchie Boys. The story also describes how the men pursued their own history to locate any relatives who had survived after the war. It is not a war story, per se, but a gripping journey into the inner workings behind the battles.

This book may be found in the Holocaust biographies section of the BSTC library. It is but one in our collection of personal stories about this time in history. Please browse and **READ**.



## Meet the Rabbi's Rabbis

Thursday, April 28, 2022 • 2 pm Rabbi Leo Baeck (1873-1956)



As we commemorate Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Memorial Day), we will examine the teachings of the man who was known as the "Rabbi of Theresienstadt". Formerly the honorary head of the Berlin Jewish Community, Baeck served his people through the Nazi years, surviving to ultimately teach at the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati and become the President of the World Union of Progressive Judaism, based in London. His writings about the relationship between Judaism and Christianity may be controversial to some, but it is inspirational to others.

We hope to do at least one make-up session each month, if possible.
- Good progress is being made on up-dating our BSTC Guide to Emergency Safety Procedures.
   Once it is completed and approved copies of the new guide will be accessible to everyone and training on the procedures will be scheduled for congregation members.
- As our BSTC activities and the number of inperson programs at BSTC increase in 2022, everyone needs to be more conscientious about security and safety. Please make sure that inside events are properly registered with Stacy and calendared, so there are no double-booking surprises.
