Message from Rabbi Norm Roman

Dear Friends,

Chanukah is coming! Chanukah is coming! Candles, latkes, dreidles, stories, songs, memories . . .

Chanukah is coming: bringing the festivity of light into times of darkness.

Rabbi Adam Greenwald, writing for the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies at the American Jewish University, reminds us of a simple but profoundly true lesson – the miracle that we commemorate on the first night of Chanukah is totally different than that of any of the other nights. Why? Because on the other nights (yes, I know – that's supposed to be the phrase from Passover, but it's important for this insight, as well), the oil to kindle the Ner Tamid that was supposed to last for only one day, miraculously kept on burning for eight days and nights, until more

holy oil could be found and delivered to the Temple in Jerusalem. The Maccabees expected the Eternal Lamp to stay lit that first night. So the Nes Gadol, the great miracle, actually didn't begin until Day #2! "The truth is that the miracle of the first night is not about the oil at all; it's about the courage of the brave soul who stepped up to light the flame!"

There had been years of darkness, pain, destruction, humiliation, hatred and warfare for the Hasmonean Jews. But some of them still had faith and hope, some were inspired to kindle a new flame. Some found the strength to bond together and create healing. Their first night of Chanukah, and ours, especially in the presence of virus and sadness and confusion, is a call to celebrate not the miracles that God did for us. but those miracles that God continually helps us do for ourselves.

Even in these darkest days of the year, let us find light and courage in the glow of our candles, and dedicate our prayers and actions to bringing that spirit to all the world.

Lynne and I wish you a Chag Urim Sameach – a happy and meaningful Festival of Lights!

food events, no refunds. (Remember that credit cards payments for any event/donation can be easily made through the BSTC website.)


JIM CLICK RAFFLE
