- The very successful Zoom presentation about Jews of India has inspired a similar program on the Jews of Scandinavia featuring BSTC's Mike Finkelstein's cousin, David Fransisco, who lives in Sweden. This program will be on Zoom on Wednesday, May 31st at 2 p.m.
- Israel at 75 Festival was celebrated on Sunday, April 30, 2023, at the JCC in Tucson. Rabbi Norm hosted a BSTC booth and project. Two shuttle buses ran to and from BSTC.

- A team of BSTC members (Mike Finkelstein, Stacy Laetsch, Esther Brill and Gary Friedman) has updated our temple Procedure Manual to document what each committee does to accomplish its mission and tasks. A link to that document is now located on the password protected page of the BSTC website, below the links to the Shofar, financial reports and minutes archives. Years ago, all procedure knowledge was conveyed verbally or in separate messages to members. It is important to document in one place what our committees do, so new committee chairs and members would not have to hunt for information. It is helpful to ensure consistency in our practices. To that end we ask that all committees review and follow these procedures. Please understand, these written procedures are not set in stone. They can change as you change the way things are done over time, as long as the change is then reflected in a revised version of the manual.

Also note, no procedure may conflict with BSTC's Bylaws, which always take precedence.

 The Program committee has scrapped the idea for a Jewish themed trip to LA or NYC and, instead, will join forces with Gary Friedman and the Men's Club to plan a May 2024 Road Scholar program on Conversos.
