Last year I was prepared to give up another tradition, but was able to celebrate Pesach with my family in NY and NJ while keeping the traditions of eating matzah and leavened stuff.

But this year I am truly looking forward to celebrating Pesach with my BSTC family who has welcomed me so warmly and well. While Teyve may sing out about "Tradition" I would truly like to sing and shout out about Community – family, friends, neighbors, I hope many of you will consider coming together as a community as we tell the story of how once we were slaves in Egypt. Chag Samea.

I shall pass this way, but once. Therefore, let me do what little I can now since I will not pass this way again.

- 3. Redefine Purpose If past roles no longer fit, create new ones. Volunteering, hobbies, and lifelong learning can provide a renewed sense of meaning.

Nothing stays still—but by embracing change rather than resisting it, we can continue to find joy, purpose, and connection at every stage of life.

Yom HaShoah Zoom Program

On Thursday, April 24th, from 12 to 1pm, we will offer a Zoom program for Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Memorial Day), featuring guest speaker, Lois Roman (no relation to the Rabbi), a Trustee of the Memorial Scrolls Trust, the London-based organization which oversees the legacy of more than 1,500 Czech Torah Scrolls that survived the Shoah. Ms. Roman has earned an M.A. in Holocaust Studies from Yeshiva University, a further M.B.A. from Columbia, and her undergraduate degree from Brandeis.

The program will discuss the miraculous story of this huge hoard of sacred Scrolls, as well as an update on the present-day Jewish Communities of the Czech, Bohemian and Moravian villages from where they came—most of them originally from the 19th century.

Many of our BSTC members' former Congregations, and several Arizona synagogues, have MST Torahs on permanent loan. They are "a symbol of hope as well as of sorrow."
